An official report of the decease of Lieutenant-Colonel James Snodgrass, Deputy Quartermaster-General upon the Staff of the Army in British North America, reached town on Tuesday last, the 16 instant. This melancholy event occurred at Halifax, Nova Scotia, on the 14th ult., after a protracted illness.

Memorial Plaque in Halifax: Consecrated to the Memory of / Lieutenant Colonel John James Snodgrass. / This officer, equally distinguished for gallantry in the field, / talents in literature, and the virtues which adorn private life, / commenced his military career in the year 1812; / served in the Peninsula, France, and Flanders, with the 52nd Regiment; / was actively employed during the whole of the Burmese War / on the staff of his father-in-law, / Lieutenant General Sir Arch'd Campbell, Bar't, G.C.B. / and subsequently held for six years / the office of Dep'y Q'r Gen'l in Nova Scotia: / while assiduously discharging with honor to himself / and benefit to his country, the duties of his public station, / it pleased the sovereign disposer of all events / to bring down his strength in his journey and shorten his days / on the 14th of January A. D. 1844, / Æ 43, / he has left a widow and an only son to lament their / irreparable loss.

She was the former Mary Alice Snodgrass, daughter of the late Robert Snodgrass and Mary Burr of Shippensburg, Pa. where she was born.

In 1885 she married William Edward Danner of Philadelphia. She lived in Philadelphia and later Chicago, where her husband was employed. In 1906 they moved to Perth, where Mr. Danner was manager of the Wampole Company. He became president of the firm in 1924 and

held that position until his death in 1934. Mrs. Danner succeeded him as president, a position she held until 1946, when she became president of the board.

Greatest of her many charities to this town was the construction of a new wing to the Memorial Hospital here in 1939. The wing was opened by the Governor-General, Lord Tweedsmuir. Providing much needed accommodation to that institution, it has been regarded since as a gesture of magnificent generosity.

In 1942, she purchased a large residence in Ottawa and donated it to the Blood Donor Service of the Canadian Red Cross. The building was given in memory of P/O William D. Hagyard, a Perth man lost in air operations in the Second World War. The building was opened by the Earl and Countess of Athlone. It rendered valuable service during the war years. Mrs. Danner presented the deed for the property to the Canadian Red Cross, through Lady Alice and the Earl of Athlone. The building is now Ottawa Red Cross headquarters.

Mrs. Danner had the unusual distinction of being a member of both the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire.

Surviving are a son and a daughter—Leslie Danner, president of the Henry W. Wampole Company Ltd., and Mrs. Harold S. Thorne of Toronto. A grandson is Edward Danner of Perth.

She was still an active member and supporter of St. James Anglican Church here. Today's services at 2 p.m. will be held there, with burial in the family plot at Elmwood Cemetery.

A presentation of a purse of gold was made to Mr. James Snodgrass yesterday on his retiring from the Grand Trunk service under the pension scheme of the company. Mr. Snodgrass has been associated with the audit of passenger receipts department for forty-five years, beginning his railway career with the Great Western Railway at Hamilton, in 1872. When that line was acquired by the Grand Trunk ten years later, Mr. Snodgrass was transferred to Montreal, and has made his headquarters here since that time. Wood-burning locomotives were in general use when Mr. Snodgrass entered railroad service, and there were less than three thousand miles of railway line in Canada, as compared with the thirty-seven thousand miles of today. During his service with the Grand Trunk, Mr. Snodgrass has served under nine general managers and presidents.

It was shown at the inquest that Snodgrass had lately lost his position as caretaker at the Chemistry Building of McGill University, and that as a result he had been depressed. He was found late on Wednesday night by his landlord, E. Lockwood, unconscious on his bed, with an empty chloroform bottle beside him. Lockwood called the ambulance, but Snodgrass died shortly after being admitted to the hospital.

Mansonville, Quebec—"Accidental death from electric shock," was the verdict rendered here today by a jury under Dr. G. W. Runnells, of Granby, coroner of the district, in the case of Ashton William Snodgrass, 28 years of age, of this town, who lost his life on Tuesday while fighting a fire with companions in a local dry-goods store. Because Coroner Runnells was informed that the blaze is believed to have been set by criminal hands, a thorough investigation was ordered and articles were removed from the scene of the fire for chemical analysis.

The late Ashley William Snodgrass was widely known in this community. He was the son of the Bell Telephone Company of Canada operator, at Mansonville. A large crowd attended the funeral service today, the interment being made in the Knowlton Cemetery.

It was learned at the inquest that the fire was discovered at three o'clock in the afternoon, on Tuesday, in the premises of the dry-goods store of A. Camille, in the central section of this town. The alarm brought neighbors and volunteer firemen to the scene. Snodgrass, who was among the volunteer firemen, seized the nozzle of a hose and entered the building with several companions. It was noticed that an electric wire was broken inside the store and was hanging down. Snodgrass was standing on water on the floor of the burning structure, and it was not determined whether he touched a wire or three water on an uncovered wire. In a moment, he suffered a shock and collapsed. His companions rushed to his aid and pulled him outside, immediately practicing artificial respiration. In the meantime, the local physician was sent for, but was absent. A doctor from North Troy, Vt., across the border line, was sent for, but when

the physician arrived, Snodgrass was dead.

Cook, of Beverly, Mass.; his father-in-law, W. R. Webster, Sherbrooke; sisters-in-law, Misses Louise and Edith Webster, Sherbrooke; Mrs. J. S. Meadowcroft, Westmount; Mrs. Henry Wilder Pierce, of Jacksonville, Fla.; Mrs. F. W. S. Webster and Mrs. O. R. Webster, Sherbrooke; brothers-in-law J. H. and A. C. Webster of Montreal; F. W. S. and R. Mrs. Snodgrass, the bride's mother, will be gowned in Burgundy crepe and will wear a black hat and a corsage bouquet of gladioli. Mrs. Forbes, mother of the bridegroom, will wear a gown of soldier blue crepe with a black hat and a corsage bouquet of roses.

Later Mr. and Mrs. Forbes will leave by motor for Muskoka Lakes, the bride wearing a green ensemble under a beige camelhair coat and a green felt hat.
