*New South Wales as it IS; or, the Adventures and Experiences of John Snodgrass.* Dublin:  
Printed for the Author.

This is an exceedingly interesting and amusing book, issued in pamphlet shape. It is not written from mere hear-say. On the contrary, the author is a gentleman of education and ability, whom we know ourselves to have been in the country about which he writes, and who is therefore a competent and most reliable authority on the subject matter of which he treats. Anyone who means to emigrate to New South Wales, or wishes to know how people live there, as also those who reside at their own snug firesides in these old countries, should read the *Life, Experiences, and Struggles of John Snodgrass* in this far-off colony of her Majesty Queen Victoria. We give a couple of extracts from the work, thus:—

“A Strange Attorney-General.

“Amongst many who aimed at high distinction, and plucked the laurels he aspired to, was the then Attorney-General, who but a short time before was a smart petty sessions’ attorney, and one who professed strong conservative political sentiments. When, however, the whirlwind of political reformation began to raise a dust, and threatened to become a southerly burster, this migrative bird flew, like a clipper, from cold to heat, and became a partisan of the Honorable Charles Slippery. A virtuous ambition seized him, when Charley first said—‘If it is possible, you shall be my Attorney-General; but in order to effect this you must become a barrister.’ The fact was, Charley could *not* get any of the then members of the bar to accept office under him, so thoroughly was his government despised, and he was therefore compelled to ask Mr. Swallow, or some other adventurous person, to accept the office, who, of course, would not do so, except for the purpose of turning it to the best account. To the surprise of every one, the petty sessions’ attorney became a barrister, in a most incredibly short time, and was almost in the same breath appointed Attorney-General for the colony of New South Wales, and in due course was presented with the silk gown, in virtue of his office. Another yet more wonderful transmigration occurred in the same person: from being a Conservative, he became a thorough Liberal in politics, at least for the time being. An excise bill, increasing the duty on spirits (rum), was to be suddenly and privately introduced to prevent monopoly. Of course, the members of the Executive were bound to the strictest secrecy. A few days before the passing of this bill, a merchant who had lived a ‘long’ time in colonies, purchased every gallon of rum that could be got, and became the sole proprietor of (it may be said) all the stock in trade of that commodity. The bill was passed, and every one had it that Mr. Short made a tremendous bit, and realized upwards of £30,000 by this speculation. Inquiries were made how he could have obtained the information which led to his making these purchases, when, indeed, it seemed almost needless to inquire, as the first fact which struck everybody was, that

the Attorney-General was a connection of his, and from being rumoured, it became publicly stated, in fact, published, that the Attorney-General had sold the pass, and his connection consequently realized this enormous sum through his instrumentality, to the detriment of the public, generally, and in violation of all honor, public morality, and integrity.”

“Farming in Sydney.

“Snodgrass had taken a small farm in the vicinity of Mudgee, which he expected to be a remunerative amusement, but in this he was sadly disappointed; for, having put in about thirty acres of tillage, which comprised the whole area of his farm, he looked forward with the expectation of reaping an abundant harvest, when, lo! the river was flooded, and behold the whole farm covered with water, which having receded, left behind an alluvial deposit of four inches in depth. In the course of a few weeks, the detriment done by this new and expeditious system of top-dressing became apparent; for every known vegetable and weed upon the face of the district were seen to make their insidious appearance, and instead of the prospects of an even crop of wheat, or barley, or maize, as had been anticipated, a most incongruous mass of many foliaged vegetable productions were the sad prospects of the new farmer. Thus were the farms on the river all destroyed by this simple process of nature, the rising of the water; which would have been of the greatest service to the land, had it been laid down in pastures, and, but for this impediment to farming, the inches, or banks of the river, are better for cultivation than any other portion of the colonies. The rich, black, alluvial soil, in many parts of New South Wales extends over thousands of acres that, in propitious seasons, would grow any vegetable in the most luxuriant manner, and with but little trouble, might be tilled for years—year after year, without being worn out, or even deteriorated and that independent of manure of any description; yet the large tracts of land, of which the country, for the most part, is composed, are unfit for agriculture, but merely of a pastoral nature, and even poor for that purpose. This fact, and the great difficulties attending the transit of goods, make it appear rather extraordinary at present, to draw a working or agricultural population as emigrants into a place where they cannot possibly have a market for the disposal of their produce, and where the importer can undersell them, as long as the mode of traffic through the interior remains in the miserable state it now is, and must be for many years to come.”

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10 Dec 1856 -- *Belfast News-Letter* (Belfast, Antrim), Wednesday, 10 Dec 1856:

The Pollok Estates.—Last week the labourers and workmen, the greater portions of whom were tenants on the estates of Creggs and Clinsks, presented Mr. John Snodgrass, who has been engaged as steward and manager since they came into Mr. Pollok's possession, with an address, accompanied by a gold watch and a service of plate, upon the occasion of his leaving the property. Mr. Snodgrass was highly deserving of this compliment, and he leaves with the regret of the tenantry.—*Westmeath Independent*.

6 Oct 1859 – *Belfast News-Letter* (Belfast, Antrim), Thursday, 6 Oct 1859:

Presentation to the Rev. Samuel Dunlop of Hillhall.-- ... “The formation of the Secession congregation of Hillhall was sometime about the year 1740, and the founders of it were chiefly Mr. John Bitter and Mr. A. Snodgrass, of Lisburn... Messrs. Bitter and Snodgrass were then deputed to attend the Associate Synod of Seceders in Scotland, and memorial them for a supply of preaching...

Mr. Yeates was averse to parting with either of his children, and at first refused to permit her to go, remarking that his mother wanted to get her to go to [Roman Catholic] chapel. After some persuasion, however, on the part of Mrs. Snodgrass, who said that Sarah was in delicate health, and that the trip across the Channel would serve her, and on the promise that she would bring her back, permission was given for the child to come to Dublin for the said purpose of her benefiting her health, and to satisfy her grandmother's entreaties. Mrs. Yeates next stated that she was informed by a letter received from Miss Emily Yeates, her sister-in-law, who has since been married to Mr. James Snodgrass, brother of the Mrs. Snodgrass referred to, that the child arrived in Dublin “all right.” On the return of Mrs. Snodgrass to London, without the child, she called at the residence of Mrs. Yeates, by whom she was asked the reason for not bringing the child back. Mrs. Snodgrass said the child was so endearing that her grandmother wished her to remain with her some short time longer, but that it was right. Deponent, resting assured that her child would be only kept away for a short time, and that for the benefit of her health, was satisfied. ... [article continues with younger daughter being whisked away to Dublin, and grandmother coming up with all sorts of reasons for not returning the two girls, ending with the parents going to Dublin to try to get their children back, and the step-grandfather preventing them with physical force.]

Tithes were an income tax on farming - usually about one tenth of the annual income. These were used for the upkeep of the Church of Ireland and were paid from the time of the Reformation. Before the Composition Act of 1823 it was possible to pay them in kind instead of money. From the time of the Composition Act they were supposed to be paid in cash and Tithe surveys were carried out in each Parish to assess what the income for that parish would be. Two people were appointed by each parish to carry out this assessment.

Both Catholics and Protestants resented this tax - tax was not payable on all land, and there was even variation on the types of land from place to place. From 1736 grazing land had an exemption - this was usually land held by landlords.

Certain crops were taxable, others weren't. Potatoes could be taxable in one parish and not in the one next door.

Tithe books are not comprehensive, people who did not hold land are not listed and some types of land were passed over absolutely. Towns and cities were usually not assessed. They are arranged by Townland and usually give the acreage held by each farmer. However, note here that the measurement used was the plantation or Irish acre which differs in size from the imperial or English acre used in the Griffith's Valuation.

The information you get from the Tithe Books is simple, townland name; landholders name; area of land and tithes paid. Some will list the landlords name as well. The original tithe books for the 26 counties of the Republic of Ireland are held in the National Archives in Dublin.
