In 1868 Joshua P. Delaplain and his eldest son, Jerome W., made a prospecting tour to Missouri and northern Kansas without finding just the location they wanted, and after considering the future of Galveston, Texas, as an outlet for the produce of Kansas by the Leavenworth, Lawrence & Galveston railroad, then talked of, the father in the early summer of 1868, came to Allen County, Kansas, spending the first night after his arrival at the Rodgers farm, southeast of Moran. The next day he met William Buchanan of Iola, who showed him the **Snodgrass** farm of one hundred and sixty acres, one mile south of Gas City. The farm was purchased, and Mr. Delaplain went east for his family, who came overland in the last of September, 1868.

Anna E. Snodgrass, Plaintiff, vs. John Snodgrass, Defendant.

Snodgrass to that of Anna E. Ramsay. And the said Defendant is notified that he is required to appear and answer said Petition on or before the 21st day of September, A.D. 1869.

E. H. Snodgrass has resigned the office of justice of the peace, in South Elsmore, and J. C. Kenyon has been appointed in his place.

14 Oct 1886 – *Allen County Courant (Iola, Kansas) (Newspapers.com)*, Thursday, 14 Oct 1886:
Mr. E. H. Snodgrass is on his ear to sell his farm. He wants to go to the neutral strip. [The “neutral strip” is now the Oklahoma Panhandle. When Texas sought to enter the Union in 1845 as a slave state, federal law in the United States, based on the Missouri Compromise, prohibited slavery north of 36°30' parallel north. Under the Compromise of 1850, Texas surrendered its lands north of 36°30' latitude. The 170-mile strip of land, a "neutral strip", was left with no state or territorial ownership from 1850 until 1890. It was officially called the "Public Land Strip" and was commonly referred to as "No Man's Land."]

Savonburgh News. Several changes are being made this year. Philo Bright moves on the Pearson farm, Philip Wheeler to the May farm, Alpheus Snodgrass to his own farm...

Savonburg [Allen Co., Kansas] Doings. Miss Cora Snodgrass arrived at home this week from Girard, Kansas.

Mr. A. A. Snodgrass will move on[to] the Mrs. Wiley farm west of town.

Savonburg [Allen Co., Kansas] News. “Lagrippe” is yet the talk of the day. On Friday, the 7th, we buried John Snodgrass, one of our brightest youths. Johnny was a good boy. He was converted to God two or three years ago, and joined the Friend’s church, and has been a faithful member ever since. The church will miss him; his young and old associates will miss him, and his father, mother, brothers, and sisters will miss him; but we have the evidence that he has gone to the God who gave him, where we can meet him again, if we live as he did.

Savonburg [Allen Co., Kansas] Items. John M. Snodgrass died last week with pneumonia. He was sick but a few days.

Edd Conner Dies; Faithful to End.

John Edward Conner died Tuesday, December 22, at his family residence at 304 East Tenth Street, after a short illness, although he had been suffering for many months from cancer of the stomach. His age was 71 years, 6 months and four days.

The bare announcement given above will mean little outside of Horton. But at all the Horton school buildings Tuesday morning the children whispered to each other, 'Mr. Conner is dead.' Downtown the word was passed from store to store, 'Ed Conner has gone.' Not just a pioneer, not just an old time Rock Island man, not just a schoolhouse caretaker--but a man respected and loved by nearly an entire community.

For 22 years Ed Conner was janitor and engineer of the Horton High School and he probably knew intimately more youngsters who have attended school there than any other Horton citizen. Though well past 70 years of age he stayed by his job until forced to his bed a few weeks before his death. He came to Horton in the first year of the town, helped erect many of the early buildings and then for 21 years worked continuously at the Horton shops. He raised a large family, he took his part in city affairs, he labored unceasingly. He was industrious, thrifty, dependable. In other words, he was the full measure of a man and his death came at a ripe age and as he could have liked--in harness almost to the end.

J. E. Conner was born in Galesburg, Ill., on June 16, 1860, and at the age of ___ moved with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Conner, to Redding Iowa. There he was married on May 5, 1884 to Ida J. Snodgrass.

In 1887, a few months after the new town of Horton, Kansas, had been started, they moved here and in this city of half tents and half shacks, Mr. Conner helped erect some of the first permanent buildings. In 1888 he went to work at the Rock Island shops, first being employed in the round house and later becoming a pipefitter. In those days railroadmen worked from 10 to 12 hours a day including Sundays at the roundhouse. Mr. Conner often boasted of the fact that in 13 years at the shops he only missed seven Sundays--less than one a year.

After 21 years employment at the shops, in 1909 he became janitor and engineer at the Horton High School. For nearly a quarter of a century he held that place, often working late at night or any length of time necessary to keep the building spick and span, and properly heated. He was intensely proud of the new high school when it was erected and took pleasure in making small repairs that might have been overlooked or slighted by many another man.

In his earlier years Mr. Conner served several terms on the city councils, and took an active interest in city affairs. He was a member of the old Free Baptist Church. For many years he was an active member of the Modern Woodmen, serving in all of the chairs. He was venerable consul of the local Woodman Camp the past year and had just been re-elected for the coming year.

He is survived by his wife and eight children, all of whom are here for the funeral. They are Roy Conner of San Angelo, Texas, Mrs. Maude Cramer of Holton, Charles E. Conner of Torrance, Calif., Bearl Conner of Horton, Mrs. Nellie Wylie of Valley Falls, Kan., Arthur L. Conner of Holton, Leo W. Conner of Torrance, Calif., and Mrs. Mabel Troth of Valley Falls, Kan. One child died in infancy in 1903.

There are also six grandchildren, as follows: Paul Cramer of Holton, Betty Jane Conner of Horton, Naomi Conner of Holton, Naomi and Jack Wylie of Valley Falls, and Donald Troth of Valley Falls.

The funeral services were held this (Thursday) afternoon, December 24, at 2:30 o'clock at the First Christian Church, with the pastor, Rev. C. M. Foust, in charge. Burial was made in the family lot of the Horton Cemetery.

Oscar T. Snodgrass of Hiawatha, Kansas, was born May 20, 1857, in Cass county, Iowa; died March 2, 1941, after an illness of a few days, at the age of 83 years, 9 months, and 12 days. He was married to Elizabeth Million October 10, 1874. To this union were born ten children, seven of whom are living.

Mr. Snodgrass with his family moved to Kansas in 1899, and had resided in Brown and Doniphan counties for the past forty-one years. [Descendant's comment: Not continuously.] A part of his life was devoted to farming, but he was best known as a peace officer, having served as a Deputy United States Marshall in Iowa, on the police force in different cities and was Under Sheriff of Brown county, Kansas, two terms. At an early age he joined the Christian church. Mrs. Snodgrass died Aug. 24, 1934.

He leaves to mourn his departure, two sisters, Mrs. Ora Milhone of Denver; and Mrs. Arthelia Prickett of Oklahoma; seven children, Homer C. of Sabetha, Kansas; Guy O. of Hiawatha; Bertram E. of Washington, D.C.; Mrs. Ethel Coleman of Stockton, California; Charles A. of Sabetha, Kansas; Mrs. Glenora Harris, of Tacoma, Wash.; and Mrs. Vera Hunt of Omaha, Nebr. Also twenty-nine grandchildren, twelve great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandchild, and a large circle of friends.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock, at Hargis Funeral Home in Hiawatha, Rev. Hugh Lomax officiating. Burial was in Mt. Hope cemetery.

Mrs. Ida Conner, 81, one of the last of the original Horton residents, died at 3 pm , Tuesday, December 10, 1946 at the home of her son Leo Conner, 144 East 7th St. following a lengthy illness. She became critically ill Monday.

Mrs. Conner came to Horton in 1887, in the first year of the town's existence – the first town lot being sold Sept. 20, 1886. Her husband, John Edward Conner, who preceded her in death Dec. 22, 1931, helped erect many buildings here that first year.

Ida Jane Snodgrass was born on Aug. 4, 1865 in Coatsville, Ia. She married J. E. Conner on May 5, 1884 at Reading, Ia., and three years later moved to Horton. They not only were Horton pioneers, but played a distinctive part in the development of the town. Mr. Conner was

active in civil affairs as an early day railroader here, and as an engineer at the high school the last quarter of his life.

Nine children were born to this union. Two, Veta, and Bearl, preceded their mother in death. Surviving are: Roy, Booneville, Ark.; Arthur, Atchison; Charles E., Torrance, Calif.; Leo W., Horton; Mrs. Maude Cramer, Holton; Mrs. Nellie Wylie, Wilmington, Calif.; and Mrs. Mabel Troth, Horton.

Mrs. Conner was a charter member of the Horton Christian Church and active member of the Royal Neighbors.

Funeral services were held at 2 o'clock this Thursday afternoon at Rake Mortuary, with Rev. Paul Skinner in charge. Music was sung by Mrs. Petty with Mrs. H.L. Cook, accompanist. Burial was made in Horton cemetery. Pall bearers were A. A. Crane, H. B. Hauck, Ray Coy, Jap Eddie, J. J. Lindsay and Henry Lading

Dear Brother & Sister & Family:

I thought I would write again. We wrote to you as soon as we got home and have never heard from you. We wrote a long letter. Smith & I both wrote we was going to send you a barrel of fall apples but could not hear from you. How are you getting along? How is all of your health? If I could see you, I could tell lots of (??). Our folks are all well. I have not got good health, but I don't complain much. The Dr. Says I never will have good health. The children all go to school but Roy; he is over five but I think he is to young (heint?). We having splendid winter.

Melvin is running a hay press so he is not home much this winter. He gets more than he can do. We built a new house this fall: 24 foot square, story and a half high. Smith bought a lot of cattle last fall so that we are tied at home about as much as ever. Bought 40 head of calves and some cows and heifers milking 7 cows this winter. Expect to milk 10 next summer.

How is Sam getting along? I suppose Jane is fat as ever. I suppose Ella goes in company by this time. Your girl I suppose is lots of help to you now. Can she play on the organ? I wish I could hear her.

If you get this letter answer it right away. I will answer it. I have the headache so bad this eve that - that - I can hardly see.

There are left to mourn her loss six children, Samuel M. of Iola; Mrs. Etta Williams of Sedan; Fred of Pierceville; Mrs. Minta Wilkins, of Monticello, Utah; Mrs. Mamie Anderson, Elgin; Arthur P., Wichita. She leaves 13 grandchildren, two brothers, and one sister. She joined the Methodist church in early girlhood. At her marriage she went to the Presbyterian church, and has led a consecrated Christian life beloved by all who knew her.

quite severely, being altogether confined to her bed. Last fall Mr. Snodgrass took her to Indianapolis and submitted her case to the most prominent medical men in the United States. They relieved her for a time, but gave only a faint hope of final cure. Her suffering was very great at times, but she bore it all like a hero. Lately she became worse, and she finally prevailed upon her parents to have an operation performed to remove the diseased bone. The doctors could promise but little from such an operation, but death was only a question of time. They consented and performed the operation on Monday last. Drs. Griffin, Clyne, and Kesner being present. On Tuesday she called her father to her bedside and informed him that she would die that evening. She made him promise that he would not allow her to be buried until he was convinced she was dead. The funeral took place from the Baptist church Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock and was largely attended by sympathizing neighbors and friends. The parents are borne up in their affliction by the consciousness that they have done all that was possible for human being to do, to nurse and relieve their darling.

The family and friends of J. K. Snodgrass “played it” on him in good shape last Friday, March 1st, 1889. Under various pretexts they sent him to town and kept him away from home all day, and when he returned in the evening tired and hungry as a wolf, he remarked to Mrs. K. that he experienced a rather tough sort of birthday, and asked for something to eat as soon as possible. When he was introduced to the heavily loaded tables, and when the neighbors and friends, dressed in Sunday attire, came pouring in, he began to see why he had been kept trotting over the country all day. Fortunately, he did not lose his appetite. All had a grand old time, and Mr. Snodgrass will long remember his 54th birthday.

Aged and Respected Citizen Dies After Lingering Illness

John Vance Snodgrass was born near Boling Green, Kentucky, Aug. 12, 1847. When 7 years old, he moved with his parents to Johnson Co., Missouri, where he lived until the year 1879, when he moved near Winfield, Cowley county, moving a few years later to Elk county where he resided until his death at Mon__e.

Mr. Snodgrass was married to Miss Anna M. Jackson Oct. 26, 1876. Three daughters were born to this union, one dying in infancy. Two daughters, Mrs. Minnie Wilson, of Moline; and Mrs. Maude Shartel of Neosho, Missouri; together with his faithful wife survive him. Beside these he leaves two sisters, Mrs. Columbia Wright of Chilhowee, Missouri; and Mrs. Lula Rice of Marshall, Missouri; and one brother, David E., of Argonia, Kansas.

Mr. Snodgrass had been in failing health for some time and for nine weeks he had suffered intensely. Death came to his relief early on the morning of June 12, 1915. He was aged 67 years and 10 months.

This is a little part of the history of a human life, the history of an aggressive, honest life. Always gentle and courteous in his social relations and in his business operations tried to do to others as he would have them do to him. This was his rule of life.

This obituary states that his early life was spent in Missouri, but his ambitious spirit turned his face westward, and in the 70's he came to Kansas [illegible] became one [illegible] pioneer. Kind in spirit, gentle in manner, he has drawn to himself a large circle of friends. It can be said of him:

"His life was gentle, and the elements so mixed in him that nature might stand up and say to all the world, 'This was a man.'" Those who have been most intimately associated with Mr. Snodgrass and who know his sterling qualities of honesty, and integrity, hold him in highest esteem.

We do well if like him we "be what we are, speak what we think, and in all things keep ourselves loyal to the true and sacred professions of friendship."

As a husband and father, he was kind and affectionate. You, to whom he was dearest, can say,

"Here sleeps one who was our friend
With meek hands folded on his breast,
When the first flowers of summer came
We softly laid him down to rest."

She leaves a husband, mother, three sisters, two brothers and number of other relatives.

When a small child she moved with her parents to Leavenworth County, about six miles southeast of McLouth, and lived there until a young woman. Then she went to Lincoln County, Kansas, to visit relatives and friends, and while there she met Mr. Snodgrass and renewed her acquaintance with him. When small children they had been neighbors and play mates. When Mr. Snodgrass was nearing young manhood, he had gone west with friends, and then they were separated for a time. After their marriage they remained in Lincoln until the early part of 1892, when they moved to Tonganoxie, Kansas, where they lived for about two years. They moved from there to Missouri, locating near Schofield, where they remained until six years ago, when they came back to McLouth and have since lived either in or near McLouth.

Mrs. Snodgrass's health has been poor at times for some three or four years, but one thought of there being anything serious the matter until six months before her death, when it became apparent she was suffering from cancer. During those six months her suffering was beyond description, yet she bore it uncomplainingly, never asking why she had been called upon to suffer so. The most she ever said would be, "Oh, I am so sick, so sick." The morning she died she started two or three hymns and sang them partly through. She realized that death was near and said that she was ready and willing to go and wanted those around her to meet her in that land where pain and sorrow are unknown.

The funeral services were held at the Baptist church Sept. 12th, conducted by G. D. Stallard, assisted by Dr. Jones. The remains were laid to rest in the McLouth cemetery near her father. The relatives of Mrs. Snodgrass desire to thank the friends and neighbors who so kindly assisted during the sickness and at the funeral of their loved one.

Parsons, Kan.—Business is booming at Clyde Snodgrass’s tractor graveyard, largely because a used tractor now days can bring more money than it cost new a few years back. The graveyard, where some 2,000 tractors have gone to die—or to be reborn—in the last 52 years, is operated by Clyde Snodgrass, a 75-year-old tractor technician, and his partner, Richard Bloomcamp, 31, of Walnut, Kan., who is learning the business.

Their establishment is located on five acres on the west side of Parsons, where they have some 170 tractors in various stages of disassembly. Some are in running order and are for sale. The rest are there only to provide parts and were purchased at farm and estate auctions and from dealers over an area of several states. The firm has shipped parts to 23 states, and it isn’t unusual for a farmer to make a round-trip of many hundreds of miles for a critically needed part.

“One reason business is booming,” Snodgrass says, “is that new tractors are priced so high. In the past two or three years, farmers all over the country have been digging out of fence corners tractors that have been abandoned and were never intended to be used again.

Snodgrass said a Virginia farmer wrote recently to inquire about an engine for a 1926 tractor he believed might be used again. Snodgrass knew of such a tractor at Thayer, Kan., and he drove there and bought the machine for \$15. “I’m almost ashamed to tell you, but we sold the Virginia guy about \$80 worth of parts. Of course, it cost us \$40 or more to go get the tractor and tear it down.” The engine parts were like new, Snodgrass said, adding, “the fellow in Virginia got his money’s worth.”

The aging craftsman, who says he gradually wants to phase out of the business and leave it to Bloomcamp, contends a well-maintained, smaller tractor on good rubber, has not decreased one whit in value over the last 20 years. One reason, he says, is that the smaller machines are in high demand by suburban estate owners and part-time farmers with lawns and small pastures to mow.

Another reason for the pickup in business in recent years is the fad for tractor restoration, just as rebuilding old automobiles has enjoyed a vogue. Many of Snodgrass’s customers seek parts for this reason.

“They’ll drive you crazy,” he said. “The fad of restoring those old machines started four or five years ago. Now they’re everywhere, all over the country. They’ll run you nuts, I’ll tell you,” he added.

Such faddists don't even need a complete tractor to enjoy their hobby, he said. For example, he said, a spoked-type of fly-wheel for a John Deere model D tractor built between 1924 and 1929 can bring as much as \$400 if in presentable condition.

Snodgrass and a friend went into the car and tractor wrecking business near Pleasanton, Kan., about 1920, when as he recalls it, there weren't too many of either machines to wreck. He subsequently operated in Nevada, Mo., and Fort Scott, Kan., before moving to Parsons in 1930, where he has remained.

His stock runs up to 250 rebuilt engine heads, rooms filled with starters, magnetos, and carburetors, racks lined with odd-sized wheels, and countless other parts.

"I get a kick out of getting a guy's tractor going again," Snodgrass said. "I've been called out in the middle of the night to help a fellow, but that's all right. I enjoy it," he added.

"I don't hunt or fish or play golf. I get my satisfaction right here. You know when it is in the working season and a fellow's tractor breaks down, he's in trouble. Most of the time, we can get them going again."

While Snodgrass isn't anxious to criticize modern tractors, he believes most of them will not take the punishment of their predecessors. There are two reasons, he says: Too much power and too many automatic things to go wrong.

He offers this advice on buying a tractor: "A fellow ought to buy a tractor one size bigger than he thinks he'll ever need. In normal use, you can hardly wear out a tractor. What you should do is take it easy and make an extra trip over the field instead of pulling everything at once."

News items are a little scarce. We can note, however, the increase in several families. ... Rev. Snodgrass had a boy added to his worldly cares on the 4th.

20 Mar 1884 – *Emporia Republican* (Emporia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 20 Mar 1884:

It is understood from recognized authority that the pulpit of the Methodist church in this place will remain unsupplied for several weeks. It is thought that Rev. W. C. Snodgrass of Wheeling, W. Va., will likely be called.

The Evening News (Emporia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Tuesday, 1 Apr 1884:

Rev. W. C. Snodgrass was presiding elder of the Wheeling, West Virginia, district, and has been transferred to the south Kansas conference and assigned to the charge at Emporia. He is about 35 years of age, and is said to be a pulpit orator of fine ability as well as a pastor who combines all the qualifications for thorough and successful work. He comes to Kansas with the best possible recommendations, and his arrival is awaited with the keenest interest by the members of the church whose pulpit he will fill and the people who attend services at that place. It is hoped that he will reach here in time to preach on Sunday.

1885 state census

P. P. Snodgrass, a young man of Emporia, went out hunting Saturday, and when he failed to come back, his friends went out to hunt him and found him a cold, damp, disagreeable corpse. His gun was not loaded, but it evidently had been when he blew into it.

29 Apr 1886 – *The Weekly News-Democrat* (Emporia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 29 Apr 1886:

The colored Baptist church of this city was crowded last night with pious and respectable colored people who seemed to realize the importance of holy Easter Sunday—peace and happiness seemed to reign in the hearts of all. ...

A colored man by the name of Utley was walking with Pleas. Burton's wife. Between Ninth and Tenth avenues on Exchange street, Burton pushed Utley away from his wife's side and said he did not want anyone to go with his wife. Frank Snodgrass overheard what Burton said and remarked in a boastful way, "I'd go with her if I wanted to." This so angered Burton that he faced Snodgrass and said, "You will, eh?" and then knocked him down. Snodgrass got up only to be again sent to the earth, and then a struggle ensued in which Snodgrass received two wounds from a sharp instrument, one above the heart, not necessarily fatal, the other in the right breast, severed an artery and pierced the right lung. Snodgrass's coat was cut in several places, indicating that the instrument that caused his death was very sharp, and that the blows dealt him were forcible and well-aimed. Burton's sister-in-law pulled him off of his victim and a brother of Utley went for a constable. It is almost impossible to get a true story of the occurrence, but we give all the particulars that can be gained by interviews with the parties who saw the killing and the facts developed at the coroner's inquest. It is said that Snodgrass was first stabbed on the sidewalk; that he gave a shriek and ran out into the middle of the road, pursued by the relentless and enraged Burton, who reached him the second time with a cruel knife thrust that ended his career on earth forever and must have given the murderer the revenge he craved. ...

John Utley—My age is 25; I know the dead man; his name is Frank Snodgrass, age about 32; he is a colored man. ...

Sena Burton, wife of Pleasant Burton—I saw my husband last night... my husband has not been living with me for a month; we are not divorced; Frank Snodgrass has never had anything to do with me; has taken me nowhere; I have not seen my husband since the difficulty; he works on the railroad...

Snodgrass was a tall and powerful man about 35 years old, and was a hard worker; he wore chin whiskers and a mustache; his hair was clipped short. The clothing he wore was very rough and completely saturated with blood. ... The murderer has not been arrested, having taken leg bail [i.e. ran away] immediately after killing Snodgrass. Telegrams have been sent all over the country, and he will undoubtedly be hunted down before morning. Snodgrass has a good character. Burton, however, is regarded somewhat in the light of a tough, having on several occasions been guilty of "scrapping."

The jury returned a verdict to the effect that "Snodgrass came to his death from wounds inflicted feloniously upon him by Pleasant Burton with a sharp-edge instrument."

The Hartford Call (Hartford, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Friday, 7 May 1886:

The commissioners have offered \$150 for the apprehension of the negro who recently murdered Snodgrass in Emporia.

The Kansas Cosmos (Council Grove, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Friday, 25 Jun 1886:

Pleasant Burton, who killed Frank Snodgrass at Emporia, April 25, after wandering away as far as St. Louis, returned to the scene of the murder and was captured last Monday.

The Emporia Democrat (Emporia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Wednesday, 7 Jul 1886:

Pleasant Burton sentenced to death for the murder of Frank Snodgrass.

The Emporia Daily Globe (Emporia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Saturday, 26 Feb 1887:

The widow of Frank Snodgrass was begging about the city yesterday. It seems that she has not prospered since her husband was killed by Pleasant Burton last spring.

30 Aug 1886 – *The Emporia Daily Globe* (Emporia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Monday, 30 Aug 1886:

Rev. W. C. Snodgrass, pastor of the First M. E. church, has received and accepted a call from the Hedding Methodist Episcopal church of Jersey City, to take effect at the end of his

pastorate here next March. Mr. Snodgrass came here from Wheeling, West Virginia, by special arrangement in the spring of 1884, and when he leaves will have completed a pastorate of three years, the full term according to the polity of his church. How he is esteemed here is best indicated by the large audiences to which he always preaches and the fact that on a number of memorable occasions his ability as a speaker has brought him before the general public—notably on the occasion of the Grant memorial services, at which time he delivered an address long to be remembered for its thought and eloquence. While here his church membership has increased about 200 and, aside from losses by removals and the colonization of West Street church, is 100 larger than when he came, the present membership being about 450. The church is one of the largest and strongest in Kansas. The people of Emporia and especially his own congregation regret that a half year is the limit of his stay here, but all unite in the pleasure afforded by the fact that the church to which he is called is the leading one in Jersey City and one of the first [Methodist Episcopal] churches in the state of New Jersey.

29 Nov 1886 – *The Emporia Daily Globe* (Emporia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Monday, 29 Nov 1886:

A telegram received at this office late Saturday afternoon from Hartford, asked that the coroner be sent immediately and stated death of a farm hand as the reason. Dr. Frost immediately answered the summons accompanied by Under Sheriff Waldo Wooster.

The victim death had embraced was P. P. Snodgrass—a young man of only twenty-one years of age. He and a friend were hunting on the farm of Henry Stratton, fifteen miles southwest from Emporia. A bird was killed, and falling, lodged in hedge brush. Snodgrass carelessly used the stock of a cocked gun to pull the dead bird within reach. The gun barrel was pointed at his stomach. He pulled the gun toward him, a twig touched the trigger, and the explosion that followed was the death-knell of a worthy young man. ...

Young Snodgrass was a native of West Virginia and had been working on the farm of Mr. Almerin Gillett, near Hartford. He would have, had he lived till the morrow, returned to his home, having quit work with that intention. He came to Kansas last winter.

Dr. Frost summoned a jury, which returned the verdict usual in cases of accidental killing. Funeral services were held yesterday, and the remains were then forwarded to deceased's home in West Virginia.

Snodgrass was well liked, and his sudden death is to be deplored.

Notwithstanding the sympathetic feeling for the young man, it is noticeable that Providence generally yields to the temptation offered by a cocked gun and a fair mark.

The Hartford Weekly Call (Hartford, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Friday, 3 Dec 1886:

Last Saturday morning about 11 o'clock, news was received here that Preston P. Snodgrass had been accidentally shot. ... He had made arrangements to start on a visit to his former home last Monday, and it is said that he was to have been married to an estimable young lady there. But such was not to be. ...

The sudden death of young Snodgrass is regretted by the entire community. We learn that a mother, sister, and three brothers are left to mourn the loss of a worthy and beloved son and brother.

The Hartford Weekly Call (Hartford, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Friday, 17 Dec 1886:

W. D. Snodgrass, brother of the young man who recently accidentally shot himself, arrived here last Friday and had the body of his brother disinterred and shipped to his old home in Virginia.

23 Dec 1886 – *The Weekly News-Democrat* (Emporia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 23 Dec 1886:

The Rev. W. C. Snodgrass was presented last Friday with a new girl baby. Mother and child doing well.

Orin Snodgrass, son of Rev. Snodgrass, had the misfortune to break his arm yesterday while “playing circus.”

This week Samuel Snodgrass, of Missouri, purchased, through J. McCreary's land agency, the old Mrs. Compton farm, on the line southwest of town.

31 Jul 1884 – *The Elk City Globe* (Elk City, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 31 Jul 1884: Oak Valley Items. Ira Snodgrass has purchased the Mike Ackley house and moved into it.

20 Aug 1884 – *Cherry Valley Torch* (Cherryvale, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Wednesday, 20 Aug 1884:

A carpenter named W. L. Snodgrass died at the residence of Theo. Hudson, on Sunday morning. He came here from Otterbein, Fayette County, Indiana, last spring and has worked for Mr. Hudson most of the time since. He was a sober, industrious man, and dying among strangers was sad, although Mr. Hudson and family did all in their power to care for him and furnish medical attention. His friends were notified of his death, but no word was received from them until Monday morning, when a request came to forward the body. It was not thought best to ship the remains, on account of the warm weather and the length of time he had been dead, and he was given decent burial in Bowen's Cemetery on Monday afternoon.

1903 – *History of Montgomery County, Kansas* (pub. by L. W. Duncan; 1903) vol. 3, pages 728-9:

William Austin—The younger element of the old settlers of Montgomery county is worthily represented in the person of William Austin, of this brief sketch. He has resided in the county since 1872, which year his parents established the family one mile west and four miles north of Cherryvale. Mr. Austin was born in Knox county, Illinois, January 22, 1864. Abel Austin was his father, and his mother Sarah T. Scott, the former a native of Ohio and the latter of Illinois. Farming was the life occupation of Abel Austin, and he died at forty years of age in 1875. The mother returned to Illinois with her large family on the eve of this misfortune, where she remained till her sons were of that age sufficient to cultivate their Kansas farm, when the family returned hither and again took up the development of a home. She passed her life in the company of her children and died in Montgomery county in 1897.

Abel Austin was a widower when he married Sarah T. Scott. His first wife died leaving him two sons, H. T. and C. I. Austin, and he was the father of five children by his second marriage, namely, William, Frank, Elmer, Homer, and Alma.

William Austin has been identified with Montgomery county continuously since twenty years of age. From 1884 to 1892 he remained an important adjunct to the domestic circle, and he gained his initial experience on a Kansas farm. In 1892 he married Amanda L. White, a daughter of John N. White and Jane A. (**Snodgrass**) White. Mr. White came to Kansas from West Virginia in 1894, and settled in Montgomery county where they still reside.

At the opening of the Sac and Fox land, Mr. Austin made a race for a claim, secured one and fulfilled his obligation to the government by proving up on the same. At about this juncture his two brothers on the family home died and our subject sold his Oklahoma

possessions and returned to Montgomery county, buying the home of his boyhood and youth. His is a fertile farm, well situated and well adapted to the purposes of stock and grain farming.

The family of Mr. and Mrs. Austin consists of four children, viz: Florence, Oma, Viola, and Elmer.

James W. and Mary Bloyd, and her father, a distinguished clergyman of the Church of God, having been for nine years pastor of a church of this denomination at Bartlettville, Oklahoma. Mrs. Snodgrass was born in Pennsylvania, and there received in the public schools her youthful education. In her present home city she is active in the work of the Presbyterian Church and the Order of the Eastern Star. The one child of her first marriage is a daughter, Bonita, who is now the wife of William J. Moran, their residence being in the state of Texas. Doctor and Mrs. Snodgrass have an adopted son, Lester Bloyd Snodgrass, and the year 1926 finds him an ambitious and popular student in the junior high school of Independence.

9 Dec 1880 – *Chanute Weekly Times* (Chanute, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 9 Dec 1880:

An old lady by the name of Snodgrass, visiting at Mr. Frewert's, was the subject of an almost fatal accident on last Saturday. She was in the store, and went to pass behind the counter, when she fell in the cellar, the door having been left unclosed. One of her lower limbs was broken in two places, and her body fearfully bruised. Dr. Brown, assisted by Dr. Sweany, adjusted the broken limb, and the patient is doing as well as could be expected, considering her age, she being 73 years old.

Chanute Blade (Chanute, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 9 Dec 1880:

On last Saturday, Mrs. Sarah Snodgrass, of Big Creek township, met with a sad accident in this city. She was in Frewert's store and walking across the room, stepped through the hatch way to the cellar, dislocating and fracturing the knee, also fracturing the leg above the knee. Drs. Brown and Sweeney were called and did what they could to relieve her sufferings. Mrs. Snodgrass is an old lady of 83 years, and the work of healing must necessarily be very slow and painful.

3 Feb 1881 – *Chanute Blade* (Chanute, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 3 Feb 1881:

Mrs. Snodgrass, (formerly Mrs. Sinnamon) a daughter of our townsman James Justice, died at St. Louis on Tuesday of this week. The remains will be brought to this county for interment.

It was a very large funeral, and the vast throng that followed the remains sorrowfully to the place of final rest indicated the universal esteem in which she was held in life. The deceased was born in Indiana but moved to Missouri in early life. She married W. G. Gets and was left a widow with two children. Had lived in Kansas 28 years, and 14 years ago she married J. T. John Thomas Snodgrass was born in Miami county, Ohio, April 4, 1840. Came to Kansas April 15, 1880, settling near Bucks Grove and residing there until he moved to Havensville in 1898. He enlisted as a volunteer in 1861 with company K 134th Ohio regiment, serving the 90-day call, later re-enlisting and serving until the end of the war. He became a member of the M. E. church February 8, 1903, and was loyal to the church to the end.

His first wife Martha died, and he then married Anna Speck July, 1895. He departed this life February 10, 1917, at his home in Havensville, Kansas, aged 76 years, 10 months, and 6 days. He leaves a wife, Anna, also a son, Ben Snodgrass of Putman, Oklahoma; besides many friends who mourn their loss.

The funeral was held Tuesday afternoon at the M. E. church conducted by the pastor, Rev. A. D. Wood, and burial was in the city cemetery.

Warren S. Plummer, former county clerk of Pottawatomie County, is secretary, treasurer and manager of the Westmoreland Mercantile Company, the largest general merchandise house in business at the county seat. Mr. Plummer started life with an earnest purpose, and had steadily kept that in view and by industry and honorable dealings had attained a position where he is recognized as one of the leading men of his home county.

He is a native of Pottawatomie County, having been born near the present Village of Flush, then known as Myers Valley, on January 7, 1875. He is of old American stock, the Plummers having come from England and settled in Virginia in Colonial times. His father Hezekiah Plummer was one of the early settlers in Pottawatomie County. He was born near Chillicothe, Ohio, in February, 1826, and when a boy entered upon an apprenticeship at the cooper and wagon making trade. He became a skilled workman. He was reared and married near Chillicothe and from there moved to Indiana. In 1862 he volunteered his services in Company I of the Thirtieth, Indiana Infantry, but after six months of service was discharged on account of disability. He then went back to Chillicothe, Ohio, and lived there until 1868, which was the date of his coming to Pottawatomie County. He took up a homestead, developed it as a farm, and sold out in 1878 and removed to Morris County, where he bought a new farm. He was a successful farmer and finally retired into Council Grove in 1887, where he died in January, 1899. Hezekiah Plummer was a republican and a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He was almost a constant student of the Bible and few excelled him in thorough knowledge of the Scriptures. As an old soldier he was a member of Council Grove Post No. 7 of the Grand Army of the Republic. The maiden name of his wife was Elizabeth Culver. She was born near Bainbridge, Indiana, in April, 1833, and died at Council Grove, Kansas, in December, 1900. They were the parents of eleven children, four of whom died in infancy. Sylvester is a Texas farmer and stock raiser. William had a farm in Oklahoma. Alice, who died in California in 1912, first married Swen Johnson, a farmer, and her second husband, N. H. Howe, a farmer, is still living in California. Clara is the wife of **M. S. Snodgrass**, a farmer living near Diamond Springs in Chase County, Kansas. George is also a Chase County farmer. The sixth in age is Warren S. Elva is the wife of M. L. Barr, of Westmoreland, who for ten years dignified the office of Probate Judge of Pottawatomie County, and is now in the insurance and real estate business.

Warren S. Plummer was three years old when his parents removed to Morris County and he grew up on his father's farm there, completing the eighth grade in the country school. When about twenty years of age he left school and began clerking in stores at Council Grove and also at Onaga. At the same time, he took a keen interest in local affairs, and being a popular

citizen, he was elected in 1910 to the office of county clerk. He filled that office six years, three terms, and at the beginning of his official term he removed to the county west of Westmoreland. On retiring from office in 1916 Mr. Plummer became manager of the Westmoreland Mercantile Company, a large and prosperous concern whose store is located on Main Street. It is an incorporated company with the following officers: S. R. Toothaker, president; Herman Zabel, vice president; and W. S. Plummer, secretary, treasurer and manager.

Mr. Plummer is a republican. He is the present city treasurer of Westmoreland. He is affiliated with Westmoreland Lodge No. 257, Ancient Free and Accepted Masons, and Topeka Consistory No. 1 of the Scottish Rite, is a member and treasurer of Westmoreland Lodge No. 252, Independent Order of Odd Fellows and a member of Onaga Camp No. 3917 of the Modern Woodmen of America.

Mr. Plummer owned a good home at Westmoreland where he had surrounded his family with every comfort. On January 17, 1906, at Onaga, he married Miss Mary Olive Middleton, daughter of John and Eliza (Kime) Middleton. Her mother is still living at Onaga and her father died there a retired farmer. A. M. Snodgrass, a farmer living near Guilford, Wilson county, whipped his wife. Lowman, a constable, arrested him and took him to Guilford and kept him over night in a store, but giving the wife whipper some privileges, early in the morning he seized a weight and dealt a blow so severe to the constable's head that he has since died, when he [Snodgrass] escaped, but he has seen been re-arrested at Independence. [Apparently, reports of his re-arrest were premature.]

Wilson County Citizen (Fredonia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Friday, 21 Nov 1873:

Susan D. Snodgrass will sue for a divorce from Alonzo M. Snodgrass at the next term of the District Court in this county. The latter is the person who killed A. G. Lowman, a Constable of Guilford township, about a year since, while in the custody of the Constable. Snodgrass escaped from the jail in Fredonia on the 18th of last November by burning a hole in the roof of the building large enough to pass his person through, and has not been heard of since.

Wilson County Citizen (Fredonia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Friday, 28 Nov 1873:

Notice to Alonzo M. Snodgrass.

State of Kansas, Wilson county. In the District Court of said county and State.

Susan D. Snodgrass vs. Alonzo M. Snodgrass.

The said Alonzo M. Snodgrass is hereby notified that he has been sued in the court above named, by the said Susan D. Snodgrass, for divorce, on the grounds of abandonment...

6 Aug 1878 – *The Leavenworth Weekly Times* (Leavenworth, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 8 Aug 1878:

Alonzo Snodgrass, the man who six years ago murdered constable Loman, of Wilson county, Kansas, passed through the city yesterday morning. Snodgrass was shackled and handcuffed and was guarded by Constable J. R. Duncan, of Fulton county, Ill., and the sheriff of Wilson county, Kansas. Snodgrass, whose whereabouts have been entirely unknown to the Kansas authorities, was captured a short time since by Duncan, and was luckily unarmed at the time of the arrest, or it would have proved no easy matter, his reputation for determined courage and audacity being well established.

It may be remembered by some that Snodgrass was originally arrested prior to the killing of Loman, for abusing his wife. While in charge of Loman, on his way to jail, a halt was made at a grocery store. Suddenly breaking lose, the desperado snatched up a heavy weight and struck Loman on the temple. Death resulted from the murderous blow. Before getting out of town, however, Snodgrass was again collared, placed in jail, and an indictment found charging him with murder in the first degree. From this jail, a rather insecure affair, he escaped, and nothing more was heard of him until his arrest on the 24th inst., on suspicion, in Fulton county, Illinois.

The murderer is a man about thirty-five years old, of nervous, excitable temperament, with a deep-set, small gray eye, almost hidden by dark, heavy brows. A wicked, hardened-looking face bears out his previous reputation of a dangerous, quarrelsome man. He is also said to be a hard drinker, although claiming that drink had nothing to do with the crime at present brought to his door, and which he does not deny committing. There is nothing in his demeanor to indicate the slightest trace of insanity.

Whilst sitting in the depot, he affected a flippant, braggadocio bearing, talked freely and carelessly, and even contemptuously, of the laws and the laws' executioners, openly asserting that no jail in Kansas could hold him for long; at the same time assuring his captors that all their trouble was in vain as they would never see him stretch hemp.

He claims to have passed part of the six years in Indiana and part in Tennessee, and has two brothers and a sister now in Illinois. His wife, who procured a divorce, is still living in Kansas.

The trial will take place in Fredonia, Wilson county, Kansas, and if the statement of his crime, as made to the reporter, is true, will probably "take a drop," notwithstanding his boast to the contrary, and which was listened to by his guards in grim silence.

3 Jan 1879 – *Wilson County Citizen* (Fredonia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Friday, 3 Jan 1879:

Alonzo M. Snodgrass recently escaped from the Ottawa jail with other prisoners, but was recaptured.

9 Jan 1879 – *The Inter-State* (Humboldt, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 9 Jan 1879:

Sheriff McIntosh received a letter from the Sheriff of Franklin county, dated the 28th ult., stating that Snodgrass and the other prisoners broke jail last Thursday week by digging out on the north side of the jail. The Sheriff was on the lookout and captured them after a chase of two blocks. It was a day time that they escaped. They were out of their cells when they got out. The Sheriff says they are hard fellows, but that he can manage them. He says if they get too high for them, he will put them in irons. The Sheriff also says that he thinks that the half-brothers sent from here are wanted somewhere either in Nebraska or Texas for murder. He says they are a hard set, and if they get away with him, he has two deputies to help.—*Fredonia Tribune*.

28 Feb 1879 – *Wilson County Citizen* (Fredonia, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Friday, 28 Feb 1879:

District Court adjourned last Wednesday morning. Judge Talcott, just before leaving, passed sentence on Alonzo Snodgrass, giving him four years in the penitentiary; and on Wood and Cole, the horse thieves, giving them five years each.

13 Mar 1879 – *Chanute Blade* (Chanute, Kansas) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 13 Mar 1879:

Last Thursday evening Sheriff McIntosh, Deputy Sheriff Schlege, and Mr. Clark, of Wilson county, arrived in town on their way to the penitentiary at Leavenworth, with Alonzo Snodgrass, who was sentenced at a late term of the District, to four years imprisonment at hard labor, for the murder of G. Lowman, in Guilford, Wilson county, in 1873.

Benjamin W. Ladd, Republican Sheriff, was born in Highland Co., Ohio, 3 May 1841. He served with Co. A, 48th Ohio Infantry, rising quickly to the rank of Captain, was wounded at Shiloh, captured and finally exchanged 23 Oct 1864. He came to Wilson Co. in Mar 1867, settling in Chetopa Twp. He was elected sheriff in Nov 1869 and re-elected, holding two terms.

Over in Guilford Twp., Oct 1872, a man by the name of Snodgrass was reported to have beaten his wife most cruelly. He was coarse, surly and brutal and was a drunkard. He was described in the Jail Calendar, Sheriff's Office Book as being 5'8", fair with black hair and blue eyes. Snodgrass was arrested by A. G. Lowman, the township constable.

A. Gilmore Lowman, who had settled at Guilford in 1869, was a bachelor. He ran a hack from Humboldt to Fredonia in 1870 and in 1870-71 drove a hack from Guilford to Neodesha. Lowman was well-liked by most everyone.

Lowman took Snodgrass to Altoona and there the constable placed Snodgrass in an unoccupied store building. Snodgrass's hands were tied for some time, and Lowman, a kind, generous man, untied the lawbreaker's hands. In the room were the weights of a pair of grocer's scales, which Snodgrass got in his possession. He hurled the heaviest one at Lowman with such force that the Constable, being struck on the head, was knocked senseless. Snodgrass escaped to Neodesha, where he stayed a day and a night, intoxicated, and slept in Phillips and Klinger's livery stable.

Doctors Craig of Guilford and Willits of Fredonia were called to Altoona to attend Lowman's injuries. The young constable's skull had been shattered, and the doctors performed the operation called trephining. A trephine was a type of small crown saw used in surgery to remove circular discs of bones from the skull. Craig and Willits removed about 1-1/2" square of bone from Lowman's skull.

Snodgrass was arrested on suspicion in Independence by the Montgomery County Sheriff, and Captain B. W. Ladd, Wilson County Sheriff, brought him to Fredonia to the county jail.

Marshal A. Gilmore Lowman died 29 Oct 1872.

Snodgrass was bound over to the next term of District Court at a preliminary trial held 17 Nov 1872 before Squire W. A. Peffer. His bond was set at \$5,000. Chase and Sweney were the prosecuting attorneys, and Miller and Russell were for the defense.

Although jail breaks were common in those days, the one which Snodgrass successfully performed surely was an unusual one.

The county jail at that time was divided by means of iron bars placed six inches apart in two compartments. The space back of the grating were the cells, and the other part of the jail was used for other purposes and contained a stove. Snodgrass on Sunday night, Nov 18, or Monday morning, Nov 19 (the exact time is uncertain), picked the lock of the partition door, and thus being able to get to the stove, took fire therefrom and burned a hole in the roof, the aperture large enough for him to escape.

Monday night, Sheriff B. W. Ladd and deputy H. C. Barrett, accompanied by R. T. Taylor, Altoona, widened their search and arrived in Neodesha in hot haste after Snodgrass. They stayed only long enough to eat and feed their horses, then rode on south toward Independence.

Apparently, Snodgrass made good his escape, for following accounts do not record his capture. The authorities thought at the time he would head south to Indian Territory and on to Texas.

Captain Benjamin W. Ladd's history appears in the 1902 Wilson Co. history.
