Some Reminiscences of Hiram Snodgrass and Family

Deepwater Creek is in the east part of Bates County and runs eastwardly, bordered on either side by a belt of timber of excellent quality and the adjoining prairie being fertile, it early attracted the attention of settlers. Just when the first settler located there or who he was, we are unable to say at this time. Among the early settlers was Uncle Hiram Snodgrass, who died the 22d day of October, 1881. His son Isaac, who was thirteen years old at the time the family settled in Bates County, is still living, and only a quarter of a mile from where they first settled. An interview with him put us in possession of the following facts:

Hiram Snodgrass, of English descent, was born in Cocke County, Tennessee, August 24, 1803. Was married to Alice Manning at a date unknown. Removed to Cooper County, Missouri, in 1832, and remained one year, then moved to Pettis County, Missouri, and lived six years. In the spring of 1839 came to Bates County and settled in section 24, township 40, range 29, on the south side of Deepwater Creek near the Henry County line. The land had just been sectionized and he entered 300 acres. Mr. Snodgrass remembers the names of the following list of settlers living in 1839 in what is now Deepwater Township. C. Schmedting lived in section 13; two Morrises, sections 13 and 14; Bradley in section 14; Means in section 16, on what is known as the old Price place; Arbuckle on the old Radford place; Scott on the Sol. Slayback place. On the south side of the creek a man named Moore, in the timber where Quick now lives; Ballou on the James Newberry place; a family whose name is unknown on the Stepp place; a family named Beaty on what is known as the Wash Ludwick farm, completes the list.

The Snodgrass family employed themselves in opening and improving a farm and did some mechanical work in the way of stocking prairie plows for their neighbors, the iron work being done by William Tyree, whose shop was just over the Henry County line. The plows were made with a large wooden mold-board with a bar and shire below, turning a furrow from sixteen to twenty inches. There was no sawed lumber to be had except that sawed with a whip saw. The logs were elevated so that one man could stand below and one above, and thus by a considerable expenditure of muscle a little lumber was obtained. Mr. Snodgrass thinks that formerly the seasons were more equable and better than now, and the necessities of life more easily obtained. They raised flax and made linen every year. Also kept sheep to supply material for winter clothing, but they had to be carefully looked after to preserve them from wolves. They also raised some cotton. Went to a mill on Grand River and also to one at Balltown owned by Austin, of the Harmony Mission. A good many Indians were about them every winter, but they did no harm, except a little stealing. Game was plenty, but Mr. S. thought he had no experience as a hunter that was worth relating. He told a story of a negro who was sleeping by a log and was awakened by an attack of a panther, but in the fight that ensued the negro came out best, the panther being killed. This occurred in the neighborhood of Papinville. Mrs. Snodgrass died in 1852, and her husband remained a widower till his death.

When the border troubles came on the old gentleman remained neutral, but Isaac was threatened with violence for taking ground against interfering with elections in Kansas, but escaped without injury. When the civil war came on the old gentleman's sympathies were with the south, and all his boys except Isaac went into the southern army. Isaac always supported the government and was in the militia company commanded by Captain Newberry.

[These seem to be Hiram & Elsa's children] Isaac, born in 1826 in Cocke County, Tennessee, is now living in section 24, Deepwater Township; was married in 1853 to Susan E., daughter of Judge John D. Myers. They have six children. Mary married Samuel Colwell; died in 1859 or 1860 <?sister of Isaac>. J. R. is now living in Texas. William G. lives in Henry County, Missouri. Nancy married John White, now living in Rich Hill. James V., living in Deepwater Township. Philena married J. M. Jennings, now living at the old homestead. Frank died at the age of twenty-four years. The above constituted Mr. Snodgrass's family.

Deepwater township is much broken by Deepwater creek and its tributaries, and hence it has considerable rough, timbered land; but the soil is generally good, and corn, grass, and cereals flourish.

It is not known, at least it is not written, when the first settler made his home in this township, but Hiram Snodgrass came into and settled in Deepwater twp., south side of Deepwater creek, near Henry county line, in section 24, in 1839. He died there in 1881. The land had just been sectionized, and he entered 300 acres. Others who lived there as early as 1839 were C. Schmedting, two Morrisises, Means, Arbuckle, Moore, Ballow, and Beatty. Isaac, a son of Hiram Snodgrass, married Susan B. Myers, a daughter of Judge John D. Myers, in 1853.

Thomas Humphrey Dickison, an honored pioneer of Bates Co., Missouri, a member of one of the oldest and best families of the state, ex-trustee of Deepwater twp., is a native of Bates Co., Missouri, as its boundaries were at the time of his birth, 23 Dec 1846, or of what is now Little Osage Twp., Vernon Co.

Mr. Dickison is a son of Humphrey and Elvira Goff (Perkins) Dodge Dickison. Humphrey Dickison was a native of Licking Co., OH. He came to Missouri in 1839 and settled on a tract of land, comprising one hundred sixty acres, in what was then Bates Co. Mr. Dickison's wife, Myra (Goff) Dickison, whom he married 6 Dec 1821, died the year after their coming West on 27 Aug 1840, and her remains were interred in the Dickison cemetery on their farm, the first burial made there. To Humphrey and Myra (Goff) Dickison were born the following children: Ruth Anne, b. 16 Oct 1822; Caroline, b. 22 Dec 1824; William Goff, b. 11 Mar 1827; Sarah Ann, b. 16 Sep 1829; Anson, b. 4 Mar 1832; Louisa, b. 1 Jun 1836; Albert, b. 15 Aug 1840.

Mr. Dickinson remarried, his second wife being Mrs. Elvira Goff (Perkins) Dodge, and to this union were born two sons: Thomas H., the subject of this review; and Edwin James, b. 17 Nov 1852, who d. in 1891 at Catskill, New Mexico, and who was buried at Trinidad, Colorado; and a daughter, Myra H., born in 1844, died in infancy.

Mrs. Dickinson, the mother of Thomas H. and Edwin James, was a native of Vermont, a highly intellectual and well-educated woman, who came to Missouri in 1833 and was employed as teacher at the old Harmony Mission school as long as the mission was maintained. She was a widow at the time of her married with Mr. Dickison. Her first husband, Nathaniel B. Dodge, was killed in 1838 in a battle with the Indians on the island of the Marais des Cygnes. The savages of the forest had been killing the cattle and hogs of the early settlers of that vicinity for some time until the annoyance had become unendurable. The hardy, fearless frontiersmen mustered a small band of thirteen men to teach the Indians a lesson in the only terms which they seemed to understand. The former demanded of the red men that they give over the marauders to be punished, and this the Indians refused to do. In the battle which ensued, two Indians were killed and others seriously wounded. Nathaniel B. Dodge was the only settler killed, but three others were wounded, among them two brothers of Mr. Dodge; Newell and Edward, both of whom recovered. The first burial made in the Balltown cemetery, nine miles north and east of Nevada, Missouri, was made for the remains of Nathaniel B. Dodge, the first husband of Thomas H. Dickinson's mother. Mrs. Dickison died in Oct 1862. Humphrey Dickison died 7 Nov 1867.

There is a strange fascination about the horrible in life which draws both young and old to witness the most revolting sights of our civilization, and it is not all queer that young, ten-year-old Thomas H. Dickison should have been heartbroken and have wept bitterly for one whole day when his father firmly and sternly refused to allow him to attend the hanging of Dr. Nottingham at Papinsville in the autumn of 1856. It is not possible to put old heads on young shoulders, and judgement and control of one's natural impulses come only with years of experience--and there is no doubt that there were hundreds of wise, old heads present at Papinsville that day to see the doctor's swing from the gallows, a sad but true comment upon curious human nature. A downpour of rain can't change it.

Thomas H. Dickison obtained his education in the "subscription schools" of Vernon county. The hard, primitive life of the early pioneers afforded but little opportunity for schooling, and with the outbreak of the Civil War in 1861 the majority of the few poor schools were obliged to close their doors. Mr. Dickison was reared on the farm, and his youth was chiefly spent in assisting with the work on the home place, and as most of his young life was spent out-of-doors, he grew rapidly into a strong, vigorous, normal manhood. He resided in Vernon Co. until 1867, when he came to Bates Co. Humphrey Dickison had entered a vast tract of land in this county, and his son, Thomas H., was given 100 acres. Mr. Dickison is now the owner of 191 acres of land in Bates Co., a farm lying 1-3/4 miles east of Spruce, Missouri. He left this state in 1870 and took up his residence in Texas, where he remained for six years, and then returning to his present home in 1876, he has rebuilt the residence, a house of two stories, and placed all the improvements on the farm.

The marriage of Thomas H. Dickison and **Emma Caroline Snodgrass** was solemnized in 1873 in Fannin Co., Texas. Mrs. Dickison was a daughter of Isaac and Martha (Stubblefield) Snodgrass. To this union were born nine children, five of whom are now living: Walter Edwin Dickison, farmer near Spruce, Missouri; Isaac Humphrey Dickison, a well-known merchant of Spruce, Missouri; Enis Pearl, the wife of C. W. Stephenson of Deepwater Twp.; Ethel C., the wife of Arthur Strode, and they reside with Mr. Dickison on the home farm; and Cyrus B., who resides on a Scully lease in Bates Co.

Mr. Dickison has seven grandchildren, of whom he is very fond: Ophelia Fay and Omeda May Dickison, children of Mr. and Mrs. Walter E. Dickison; George Humphrey & Hazel Pearl Dickison, children of Mrs. and Mrs. Isaac Humphrey Dickison; Lois Alene Stephenson, the only daughter of Mr. & Mrs. C. W. Stephenson; Walter Lee & Velma Ruth Dickison are children of Cyrus B. Dickison.

For three generations of the Dickisons, there has been a Humphrey Dickison in the family, a noble, old name which the bearer should be proud to bear and ashamed to tarnish by a single unworthy act.

The saddest event in the life of Thomas H. Dickison occurred 27 Oct 1917, when death entered the Dickison home once more and again broke the family circle. Mrs. Dickison, her

husband's faithful and brave helpmeet and beloved companion for 43 years, the loving mother of their children, answered the last summons las autumn.

Mr. Dickison has always taken a deep interest in the general growth and developoment of his county and state and has manifested a most commendable interest in the public and political affairs of his township. He has served one term in the office of township trustee of Deepwater twp. He has watched Bates county steadily emerge from an unsettled wilderness and prairie and become one of the best and most prosperous sections of Missouri, and during all these years he has contributed his full share toward bringing about this marvelous development. Thomas H. Dickison is one of the county's most excellent citizens, a noble son of a noble father.

The steam swept through the whole length of the boat with the strength of the lightning torrent carrying every thing before it. A great number were blown overboard, nearly, if not quite all, were scalded severely, some completely excoriated and shockingly mangled; some frantic with despair and agony jumped overboard; the deck was strewn with fifty helpless sufferers, and the river alive with them, swimming to the bank, then from it, in the wildest phrensy. ... Thirty helpless sufferers were brought here from Princeton, of whom 16 have since died. Twenty or upwards were left at Princeton, of whom we are informed this morning 13 have died. ...Every name it was in our power to obtain is given in the list below. ...

Edmond Snodgrass was born Cook [Cocke] county, Tennessee, Sept. 17<sup>th</sup>, 1808. He moved with his parent to Missouri in the year 1818. He made a profession of religion and joined the M. E. Church south, in 1847. In that church he lived a faithful member until Aug. 1879, when death released him from the cares and the trials of this life. He was afflicted for some time before his death. His sufferings were severe, but is said to have borne them with Christian patience. During his sickness he would often call his family around him and tell them of the greatness of God. “Jesus can make a dying bed, / Feel soft as downy pillows are; / While on his breast my head, / And breath my life out sweetly there.”

Bro. Snodgrass is gone from his friends on earth. They morn his loss, but they mourn not as those without hope. He has crossed over the river, and we trust, he is resting under the shades of the trees of Paradise on the other shore.

Let us all be prepared for a happy meeting in that better and happier clime.

While he is thoroughly experienced in this line of work, having devoted about twenty-one years of his life to it, the Snodgrass greenhouses of Clinton dates its beginning only about seven years ago. Mr. Snodgrass was married in 1913 to Mrs. Nona Cherry of Nevada, Missouri, and a daughter of Dudley and Lula (Thomas) Thomas. The father and the mother reside in Clinton. Mrs. Snodgrass has one sister, Daisy, now the wife of James Grant, and a brother, Taylor Thomas, who resides in Nevada, Missouri. Mr. Snodgrass is a member of the Modern Woodmen of America, and he and his wife have an extensive acquaintance in Clinton and are popular.

Kansas City, Jan. 14.—Mary U. Snodgrass, by her attorney, James T. Clayton, began a lawsuit in the circuit court yesterday to recover \$10,000 on a promissory note made by John H. Owens and Clinton D. French several years ago to her husband, T. C. Snodgrass.

The suit recalls the manner in which T. C. Snodgrass procured a divorce from Mrs. Snodgrass, which was so peculiar that Judge John W. Henry of the circuit court will refer to it tonight in his lecture on “Divorce” at the First Congregational church. Mr. Snodgrass was a capitalist of this city, who had lived seventeen years here and had made a fortune speculating in negotiable paper. He lived at 1227 Troost avenue with his wife. He died February 28, 1893. He was sick for several weeks before his death, and during this sickness his wife was his faithful nurse. He left no will, but while searching through his private papers to see if there might be one, Mrs. Snodgrass was astonished to find a decree of an Oklahoma court granting him a divorce from her. It developed that about a year before his death Mr. Snodgrass went secretly to Oklahoma and got a divorce from his wife. He came back with the decree of divorce in his pocket and hid it away, never saying a word about it to his wife, even while she was nursing him through his last illness.

Mrs. Snodgrass brought suit in the circuit court to get a widow’s share of the Snodgrass estate, and the court, after hearing the evidence, declared that an injustice had been done and set aside the divorce decree, gave Mrs. Snodgrass a widow’s share of the estate, and appointed her administratrix of the whole estate. It is as administratrix that she brings the suits against French and Owens.

Johnson in merchandising. He then engaged in farming, and since that time has engaged in different enterprises from 1875 to 1880, merchandising in Holden, then lived a time in Bates county. In the fall of 1881, he came to Columbus and bought out G.C. Wolfe, and now provided with full stock carries on a general mercantile trade, which, though good, is rapidly increasing. The coming spring will find him supplied with a full stock of farm implements and general farm supplies. Mr. Wright being a native of Johnson county, has witnessed many of the changes which have come and gone. He is an enterprising liberal spirited man, ever ready to encourage that which is calculated to build up the township and county. He is a worthy member of the M.E. church, south.

May 9th, 1888

We left home at 7 o'clock Wednesday morning, reached Clinton at ten a.m. Went to the depot, got our tickets, which cost us \$15.65 each. Waited there until 8:15 boarded the train. The night was a long rainy one. Commenced hailing at Appleton City, just poured down as we passed through Rockville and Schell City.

While at Clinton we visited the "Great Artesian Well." Took the train at Clinton traveling S.W. until we reached Parsons, Kans where we turned almost directly South.

From Clinton we passed through Ladue, Montrose, Appleton City, Rockville, Schell City. Crossed the Osage then on to Nevada. There the coach was filled up and we were told to take a back coach. Started, and was sent back. On we went to Ft. Scott. Then across S. E. Kans to Parsons. Stopped 20 min. for lunch, it being about midnight. Then to Osuego, Chetopa, which is the last station in Kans. Reached Vinita [Craig Co., Oklahoma] just as day light dawned. Run 32 miles over the prettiest country I ever seen to Chouteau I.T. [Indian Territory, now Mayes Co., Oklahoma] Arriving at this point at 5:30 a.m. May 10. Took breakfast at the restaurant, started with Ruf and Billie. Got to Rufs for dinner. Went to B's that night, to school the next day home with Ruf to ch on Sunday home with B's and to the R.R. by 5:30 Monday morning. Bound for Tex. crossed the Arkansas R. at Muskogee. Took breakfast at

Eufaula crossed both forks of the Canadian, and on through several little stations. Atoka being the largest, have some coal mines near this place. Passed several little towns, crossed Red R. and enter Tex.

Stop at Denison 1 hr out to Whitesboro, changed cars, then on to Gainesville, Myra, St. Jo, Nocona and Belcher. At 7:30 May 14, 1888.

June the 27 we leave here for Gainsville. Took the train at 7:30 a.m. at Belcher. Reached Gainesville at 10 a.m. got off and stayed two days visiting our relatives. Mrs. Garrison, Cox, and Halsall. Left G. V. June the 29 at 10:10 and reached Whitesboro at 11 a.m. Ruf Noland met us then we went home with him, 8 mi south-east of this place and stayed until the morning. Took the trail at 11 a.m. Stopped at Denison one hour waited at Gibson 2 hrs on account of the wreck and got to Chouteau at daylight. At 9:25 Ruf and Billy got there and we started out to Rufs. Got there at noon. I got to Rufs on the 6th of July, was taken sick the 19th went over to Billie's the 29 of July. Left there for home the 27 of Aug. got to Columbias the 28 and stayed there until the 17 of Oct when I came home and was just able to walk around.

Friday morning last, about 9 o'clock, two farmers residing in Morgan county, four miles southwest of Tipton, named Thos. G. Snorgrass and Wm. W. Carpenter, became involved in a difficulty near the home of the former, resulting, it is stated, from raking up an old feud. A fight ensued, in which Carpenter was fatally shot in the back with a revolver in the hands of Snorgrass.

The rumors concerning the affray are various and contradictory. Snorgrass's friend say that Carpenter was advancing on his opponent with an open knife, avowing his intention to cut him, and Carpenter, who is now dying, states that he drew no knife and that he was running from Snorgrass when the fatal wound was received.

The general reputation which Snorgrass bears is good. Carpenter has a wife and four children. Snorgrass immediately surrendered to the authorities and says he can prove that his action was purely in self-defense. There has been bad blood between the two, who are near neighbors, for some years, but their differences were thought to have been amicably adjusted some months since, when Carpenter spent the night with Snorgrass, ate at his table, and both neighbors shook hands across the old gulf.

About a month ago, however, they renewed hostilities, and at that time Carpenter is said to have cut at Snorgrass with a knife, but his intended victim eluded him and has since been carrying weapons for self-defense.

Mrs. Snorgrass was born near Boonville, in Cooper county, and was the daughter of William and Sarah Poor. Mr. Poor was one of the prominent pioneers of Cooper county, and proprietor of the land upon which Boonville now stands. Candace Poor was united in marriage to Isaac Snorgrass on March 22<sup>nd</sup> 842, when she removed with him to Moniteau county and lived on the farm now owned by her son, William Poor Snorgrass, until about seventeen years ago, when the family moved to the Snorgrass homestead in the southern suburbs of Tipton.

Mrs. Snorgrass was the mother of eleven children, eight of whom survive her. She died of consumption, at the age of 61 years, 2 months, and 1 day, steadfast in the assurance of a blessed immortality, full of faith,, patient in her suffering, and resigned to the call of the dark

winged messenger, whose mandates all must obey. Her departure was peaceful, "As one who wraps the drapery of his couch about him and lies down to pleasant dreams."

She had been a devout and conscientious member of the Methodist Episcopal church since the age of twenty years and during her life in Moniteau county hundreds of her neighbors can bear willing testimony to her eminent piety and shining christian virtues.

Death of One of Our Oldest and Most Prominent Citizens – We announced last week the serious illness of Mr. Isaac Snorgrass, and stated that his recovery was doubtful, and yet the end came unexpectedly. Between two and three o'clock Friday morning he said to his physician and attendants that he must surely be better; he felt stronger. He engaged in conversation more freely than at any time during his illness, and discussed current affairs with interest. He was observed to attempt to turn over and those in attendance went to his assistance only to find that all was over. Without a struggle, without a pain or a moan his spirit had taken its flight to its Maker. The announcement of his death brought forth an universal expression of regret from our people. For so many years he had been a familiar figure on our streets; so many had reason to recall acts of kindness at his hand; he had been so long and so closely identified with the commercial affairs of the city that it was hard to realize that he was indeed dead. Mr. Snorgrass had for years been a member of the Masonic order and was buried with honors by that fraternity. Members of the order were in attendance from Bunceton, Otterville and California. The lodge formed in procession at their lodge-room on east Moniteau and marched under the leadership of Mr. L. F. Wood as marshal to the family residence at the head of Moreau avenue, and from there escorted the remains to the Baptist church where Rev. Edward James delivered an appropriate and feeling discourse. His text was Hosea xiii, 14.

The deceased was born March 9, 1821, in Casey county, Ky., and was therefore in his sixty-seventh year. He emigrated with his father to this state in 1840, and the family settled on the farm now owned by Mr. Chris Gleser, a few miles south of this city. While his educational advantages were limited he was trained to industry and frugality, those essential elements in a business career. He was married in early life and with a patrimony consisting only of a brave heart, a strong arm and a clear head he began the struggle. He engaged in farming for a number of years and gradually laid the foundation for a handsome competency. During the war he moved to this city and engaged in the mercantile business until a few years since, when he retired and was succeeded by his son and son-in-law, who now constitute the firm of Snorgrass & Fitschen. He was the largest stockholder in the bank in this city, besides owning several valuable pieces of town property and considerable real estate in the country. Mr. Snorgrass was a very quiet and unostentatious gentleman, a deep thinker and one whose judgement was highly regarded by those who knew him. He was kind and considerate in his intercourse with men and while he gave largely and frequently to charity it was always in that manner so much commended by the Master, where the "left hand knew not, what the right doeth." Mr. Snorgrass joined the Baptist church in 1853 and remained steadfast to the end and died in the hope of a glorious immortality in the realms beyond. He was married three times, his last wife



surviving him. His first wife bore him eleven children of whom seven, five sons and two daughters are living, viz: W. P., Dunaway, Daly, Lacy, Clyde, Mrs. C. G. Ely, all of whom live in this city, and Mrs. L. S. Calvin of Greenford, Ohio, who alone was absent at the end, being detained by the serious illness of a little babe. Besides his immediate family he leaves a large kindred and a host of friends to mourn his death. The following tribute is the offering to his memory by a niece in her teens:

I, William P. Snorgrass of the town of Tipton, County of Moniteau and State of Missouri, do make, publish and declare the following to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills and codicils heretofore made by me.

First. I direct my executors to erect a modest tombstone upon my lot wherein my body shall be buried after my death at a reasonable cost and that the lot wherein I shall be buried shall be kept in respectable appearance and order for the period of ten years after my death at a cost of not exceeding five dollars per year.

Second. I direct my executors of my estate to pay all my just debts which I may owe as soon after my death as possible and to pay the expenses of my funeral, inclusive of the Pastor Ten dollars, which I desire to be a plain one.

Third. I hereby give and bequeath to the Baptist Church at Tipton Five hundred dollars to be used for repairs upon the Church and building only, and to be paid to said church after my death and the death of my wife, Francis P. Snorgrass.

Fourth: I hereby give and bequeath to my wife, Francis P. Snorgrass all of my household property and kitchen furniture for and during her natural life; and after the death of my beloved wife, I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter, Nora F. Bowles said household and kitchen furniture absolutely to do with as she pleases. And I hereby devise to my beloved wife, Francis P. Snorgrass for her use and enjoyment during her natural life only, my house and lot, of which I am seized in fee and upon which I now reside, described as follows, to-wit: The East part of Lot #171 and a part of Lot number 172 in the original town of Tipton now city of Tipton and East part of Lot #2 of Snorgrass addition to said City of Tipton, all in said County of Moniteau and state of Missouri, being the same property upon which my house stands where I now reside in said town. And also hereby give, devise and bequeath the use, rents and profits arising from nine acres of land described as follows, to-wit: Beginning fifteen feet south of the southeast corner of Lot No. 12 of Snorgrass second addition to the City of Titon, Missouri, and running thence south to the north line of Peter Hainens place, thence west along the north line of Peter Hainens' place, six hundred and thirty three (633) feet; thence north to a stone at a point fifty feet west and fifteen feet south of the southwest corner of Lot No. 21 in said second addition; thence six hundred and thirty three feet to the place of beginning, estimated at nine acres more or less, of which I am also seized in fee; for and during her natural life only, my said wife must keep the taxes paid, make necessary repairs and pay for same, and keep the houses insured upon the property paid out of the rents, and profits arising from said property, and other provisions hereinafter made for her benefit. And it is my express will that upon the death of my said beloved wife Francis P. Snorgrass, that my daughter Nora F. Bowles shall have the use of said house and lot and the said nine acres so long as she shall live, or during her natural life; provided always that she pays the taxes, keeps up the insurance and makes the necessary repairs, thereon out of the rents and profits arising from said property and the other provisions of this will; bur should my said beloved daughter fail or refuse to live in said house upon said lot or use said lot and nine acres hereinbefore mentioned and described upon the conditions mentioned for said use, then it is further my express will that the trustees hereinafter named and provided for my personal estate, shall proceed to sell same privately or publicly, or any part of said real estate as their judgment may suggest, after administration, and pay over the proceeds therefrom to the trust hereinafter mentioned and created, and the same shall become a part thereof, to be used and paid out as therein provided.

Fifth. It is my express will and I hereby convey, transfer and assign to Jacob Hainen Jr. and William P. KuttentKuler all of my personal property consisting of notes with personal security for money loaned, notes for money loaned and secured by mortgages and deeds of trust, and other securities and investments of which I may be possessed at the time of my death, as well as all cash I may be entitled at the time of my death, In trust, to hold for the purposes mentioned in this my last will and testament; and for the benefit and use of the legatees of my estate, and same to be cared for, half in trust, protected and loaned upon good first class personal or real estate security and the interest thereon to be collected by said

trustees once a year, and oftener if found practical and desirable, and said trust funds to be paid out as directed in this my last will. Said trustees for their attention, care and management of the personal property herein conveyed to them in trust, shall be paid at the rate of not exceeding one per cent per annum on the total amount so conveyed to them in trust.

Sixth. It is my will that there be paid out of the trust estate so created by the 5<sup>th</sup> paragraph of this will and hereby placed in the hands, and put under the watchful care and management of the said Jacob Hainen Jr. and Wm. P. KuttentKuler as trustees, the following sums of money annually, to my said wife Francis P. Snorgrass four hundred dollars annually, commencing from the date of my death; and to my wife's sister, Lucy Carpenter fifty dollars annually, commencing from the date of my death so long as my said wife shall live, both of said payments to cease upon the death of my wife; and then the income shall be paid to my beloved daughter Nora F. Bowles on one half of said trust fund during her natural life, less the charge for cars and subject to the other conditions of this my last will.

Seventh. It is my will that upon the death of my beloved wife that my estate shall be equally divided between my daughter, Nora F. Bowles and my wife's sister Lucy Carpenter they two to share equally, the one half to be paid over to said Lucy Carpenter in such securities as are in possession of my said trustees at the date of my wife's death, the other half and the income therefrom to be continued in the possession of said trustees, and except the percentage allowed to such trustees, the interest arising therefrom to be paid over to my said daughter, Nora F. Bowles annually, commencing from the date of death of my said wife, and it is further my will that if my said daughter shall lose her husband, J. Denzil Bowles, then said half held by said trustees of my said estate shall be paid and handed over to my beloved daughter, Nora F. Bowles absolutely, to do with as she may desire; or if my said daughter shall have a child of her body, then it is my will that said half of my said estate shall continue to be administered in trust for my daughter during her lifetime, and upon her demise the same shall be paid over to said heir of her body, if it shall have reached the legal age of maturity, but such estate shall only be paid over to an heir of her body; and it is further my express will and desire that if neither of the last two conditions occur during the lifetime of my said daughter, Nora F. Bowles, then said one half interest upon the death of my said daughter shall be paid over to my brothers and sisters if living, and if not then living, their several shares herein provided for if living shall be paid over to the children of their respective bodies and to the heirs of their bodies under the laws of descent and distribution, and it is further my express will and desire that if my wife shall survive my said beloved daughter, Nora F. Bowles and if said daughter shall not leave an heir of her body, then upon the death of said beloved wife, said trustees shall pay over to my said brothers and sisters and to their bodily heirs as hereinbefore set out, the one half of my estate.

Eight. The said trustees shall have and are hereby clothed with full power and authority to have the care of said personal property and manage the trust so created of said personal property and as soon as this will is proved, probated and said estate inventoried in probate court, my executors shall pay and turn over to said trustees said personal property and money less enough to pay expenses in probate court as soon as said trustees shall give bond, and they shall have all necessary power and authority to collect, preserve, loan and safely secure said personal estate to be so held by them in trust as aforesaid.

Ninth. It is my express will and desire that the trustees hereinbefore mentioned, named and appointed to take charge, care for and manage certain personal property mentioned in the fifth paragraph herein, do make an annual settlement of said trust estate in the Circuit Court of Moniteau County, Missouri, after settlement with the executors of my estate in the probate court of said county. And I hereby expressly provide and it is my express will that said executors and trustees in case of any contest be commenced to defend my will to the final judgment of the court of last resort in such cases and pay therefor out of my estate, and when my said trustees or executors shall need any advice or counsel or legal assistance, I hereby recommend them to employ James E. Hazell. I have had occasion to confer with him and am glad to say have found him to be a true man and reasonable in his charges. I desire him to help in these matters. In case of the death of one of these trustees, it is my will that the

survivor shall execute the trust and if both shall die, then I ask the Circuit Court to appoint a proper trustee.

Tenth. Again emphasizing my confidence in said trustees herein mentioned I hereby appoint the said Jacob Hainen Jr. and William P. KuttentKuler executors of this my last will and testament and request them upon all legal matters to consult James E. Hazell, hereby revoking all former will by me made. All interlineations or erasures, made before the signing and execution of this will executed in duplicate.
