For many years he competed as a single sculler all over the United States. He last rowed in the Head of the Charles Regatta the year he turned 80, and he continued rowing for enjoyment until age 88.

After retiring from medical practice, Dr. Snodgrass published a monograph summarizing his research on the enzyme ornithine transcarbamylase, and a memoir, "A Life in Academic Medicine." Known internationally for his research, he was often invited to speak at medical schools and scientific meetings. He was an active Harvard alumnus, interviewing prospective students both in Indiana and on the North Shore for more than 40 years.

Phil will be mourned and greatly missed by both family and friends. He and his wife enjoyed a long, loving relationship, and she fondly remembers happy trips together in their later years. His family will miss his guidance and will remember their happy summers in Maine. The Brooksby Village community will miss his many personal contributions.

A celebration of Philip Snodgrass's life is planned for Monday, January 14, at 11 a.m. in the Brooksby Village Chapel. Contributions in his name may be given to the Southern Poverty Law Center, Doctors Without Borders, the Brooksby Village Benevolent Fund, or your charity of choice.

Bronx—Media research pioneer Alain Joseph Tessier, who co-founded Mediamark Research Inc., passed away peacefully August 26, 2018, at the age of 85, surrounded by his family at Calvary Hospital in the Bronx, New York. Alain had succeeded in beating two forms of lung cancer into submission and remission, but succumbed to complications from Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease, according to his wife Merle (Sprinzen) Tessier.

He was predeceased by his brothers, Gaston, John, and Louis, and sisters Pauline and Carmen. Youngest brother Tim will be telling stories at the Celebration of Alain’s life, time and location to be announced. We are sure T-Boy, as he was affectionately called by the family, will be sorry to miss this party as he always loved a good one.

“T-Boy” was born in a French-speaking home in Burlington, Vermont, August 14, 1933. His mother Marguerite made sure he attended Catholic schools, including St. Michael’s College in Winooski, Vermont, and Notre Dame, where he earned a Master’s in literature. Though his parents Amadee and Marguerite came to this country with nothing, they made sure to educate all of their children. Alain, in turn, made sure it was possible for his children and grandchildren to attend university.

“Husband” was the name given to Alain by his first wife, Rosemari Jean (Snodgrass) Tessier. They were married in New Carlisle, Indiana, on December 18, 1957. “Roe” predeceased him in 2007. Together they had three children: Timothee Erik Tessier, born in Nuremburg, Germany (deceased 1999), Denise Allyn Horton born in Chicago, Illinois; and Daniel Helen Tessier, born in New York, New York. Timmy’s widow Kathleen Tessier made Alain’s life a little more beautiful each time she saw him with her botanical talents, and chef Robert Horton increased Alain’s waistline a little with each visit to his restaurant or home by serving delectable creations, which usually included pork something or other.

“Grandpa” was blessed with seven “Bag o’ Baggages”: Renee Marguerite Nunley; Rebecca Rosemari, Marguerite Francis, Kaela Heather, and Colleen Carmen Horton; and Zoe Jane and Benjamin Alain Minto. They were often blessed with his blueberry pancakes and real maple syrup.

After Rosemari’s death, and after more than 20 years of being professional colleagues and friends, Alain and Merle kindled a romance. They were married on September 12, 2010, in East Providence, Rhode Island. Traveling, cooking, eating, and being together were constant sources of comfort and enjoyment—to the extent that when they were not together for some reason, Alain’s constant refrain was “Where’s Merle?”

Alain’s career started in the production department of the Chicago Tribune, continued with a long and productive stint at the American Research Bureau, and proceeded apace as Vice-

President, Director of Client Services, for the Target Group Index. But it is his role as co-founder of Mediamark Research Inc.—known widely as MRI—where Alain made his greatest and most lasting contribution to media research.

Along with his great friend, Timothy Joyce, Alain confronted the unenviable challenge of trying to compete successfully against an existing magazine and newspaper audience ratings service and even supplant that service. Starting from a Manhattan hotel suite in the late '70s, Alain and Timothy built a thriving business and, along the way, succeeded in establishing a new method in the United States for measuring magazine readership. The competition was keen and fierce at times, but the debates always centered on issues of research quality, utility, and validity. Almost 40 years after its initial offering, MRI continues to adhere to the rigorous research standards demanded by Timothy and Alain through what is now known as GfK MRI.

Leading a ratings service is seldom pleasant. It has often been said that the minute MRI released its twice-yearly data, half of its clients were more than a little displeased. So Alain spent the better part of the last quarter century explaining and analyzing data and responding to client complaints. He would demonstrate complete familiarity with the critical research issues and provide lines of analysis that the magazines never thought of themselves, all the while displaying a vast knowledge of the workings of magazines and advertising agencies. Alain did all of this in his inimitable style: half Franklin Roosevelt, half Casey Stengel. Like Roosevelt, Alain would listen cordially to the litany of complaints, nodding at the appropriate moments, and every one of the publishers would leave the meeting wrongly thinking Alain was agreeing with their point of view. Like Stengel, his responses would sometimes constitute a wide-ranging—some might call it rambling—discourse sprinkled with literary references on brand equity, circulation management, sampling error, and arcane methodological issues. Sometime later, many a client likely reflected on what Alain had said and realized they had witnessed a master dialectician ply his trade. This mixture of warmth, circumlocution, and graciousness earned him the respect of his peers and clients.

Alain was a lover of boating, good food, wine, and people, and less-good vodka. He led a life larger than his 6' 1" 280-pound frame. To his family, he was known as an adventurer, bedtime musician, kitchen table artist, poet, and captain of many crunches. We all have fond memories of The Pit, a boat larger than his first apartment in Chicago that he shared with his young family, for which it was aptly named. Alain had an appetite for life to the end: The morning of his death, T-boy drank a large cup of coffee and ate a cinnamon roll bigger than a moose head. ~ and that's the true truth.

 Albany, N.Y., July 29.—The mystery of the disappearance of Miss Dorcas I. Snodgrass, a nurse, missing from her sister’s home at Mount Vernon, N.Y., since July 17, is believed to have been solved by the finding of a body of a woman in a creek near Catskill. The body is said to tally with the description of the missing young woman, and the name “I. Snodgrass” was found on her corset cover. Another initial, believed to have been a “D” had been obliterated. There were no marks of violence on the body.

New York, July 29.--William Snodgrass of Meyersdale, Pa., went to Catskill, N.Y., today to view the body of a young woman found in the Catskill river there, on the possibility that it may be the body of his sister, Miss Dorcas Snodgrass, a nurse who disappeared from her sister’s home at Mount Vernon, N.Y., on July 17. It has been reported that Miss Snodgrass is aboard the steamship Minnehaha now on her way to Southampton, but until this is proven or disproved, relatives are following every clue. The body at Catskill tallies in many respects with the description of the missing nurse.

Lima News (Lima, Ohio) (Ancestry), 31 Jul 1912:
 Catskill, N.Y., July 31—While the body of Miss Dorcas Ijams Snodgrass, found in Catskill Creek eleven days after she disappeared, today was being shipped from Mount Vernon to the old family home in Martinsburg, W. Va., District attorney Wilbur and coroner Vanderburg were considering the advisability of asking the family for permission to remove and examine the viscera of the young woman to search for poison.

Dr. J. L. Rooney, of Albany, who performed an autopsy, is authority for the statement that the condition of the body was such as to indicate death by drowning, but the shallow water in which it was found made it probable that Miss Snodgrass was inert and possibly unconscious when her body was placed in the water. An examination of the body revealed nothing to indicate murder.

A “dummy” placed in the water at the mouth of the creek by Wilbur became fast on the flats before it had gone one eighth of the distance to the place where the girl’s body was found. Wilbur said this did away with the theory that the body was washed in from the Hudson. Today a canvas of all the motorboats known to have been in the Catskill Creek within the last ten days failed to reveal anyone who admitted knowing the dead nurse.

W.D. Snodgrass, 83, a Poet of Intensely Autobiographical Themes, Is Dead

W. D. Snodgrass, who found the stuff of poetry in the raw material of his emotional life and from it helped forge a bold, self-analytical poetic style in postwar America, winning a Pulitzer Prize for his debut book, died on Tuesday at his home in Erieville, N.Y., in rural Madison County. He was 83.

The cause was lung cancer, his wife, Kathleen Snodgrass, said.

“Your name’s absurd,” Mr. Snodgrass wrote in an early poem, “These Trees Stand...,” as if at once to silence the snickering and skewer himself. But only a few lines later he sang out his name, declaring, “Snodgrass is walking through the universe,” as if to announce the sort of poetic journey of the self he had undertaken.

It found immediate expression in “Heart’s Needle,” a collection he published at the age of 33 in 1959. The book, which won the Pulitzer Prize the following year, startled American poetry circles and prompted a letter of praise from Robert Lowell.

Lowell, who had taught Mr. Snodgrass in a poetry workshop at the State University of Iowa (now the University of Iowa), had at first admonished his student about his early poems. “He said, ‘You’ve got a brain; you can’t write this kind of tear-jerking stuff,’” Mr. Snodgrass recalled in an interview with *The New York Times* at his home in October.

“But I came to a point where I had to rebel against my teachers, including Lowell,” he said. “I wanted to use a much more simple and direct kind of language, something that would be common without feeling worn out or used.”

Lowell changed his mind, persuaded Knopf to publish “Heart’s Needle” and called it a “breakthrough for modern poetry.”

At its center is the title poem, a 10-part plainspoken sequence about the loss of his young daughter, Cynthia, through his first divorce. He began composing the lines on the back of a concert program and finished most of the rest while working nights as a hospital orderly.

In formal, tightly controlled, rhyming stanzas addressed to his daughter, the poem’s tone is loving but rueful, often self-critical and anguished, as in these lines:

Winter again and it is snowing;
Although you are still three,
You are already growing
Strange to me.

“Snodgrass has built a moving poem out of something we treat far too casually: early divorce, in which it is the love between children and their parents that receives the deepest wounds,” the critic M. L. Rosenthal wrote in an influential essay in *The Nation*.

Mr. Rosenthal labeled the style “confessional,” recognizing a new school of poetry in which he grouped Mr. Snodgrass with Lowell, Theodore Roethke, Delmore Schwartz and Anne Sexton, who was at one point a student of Mr. Snodgrass’s.

Some critics deplored the “confessional” mode, saying it gave license to excessive self-

exposure and risked sentimentality. James Dickey called Mr. Snodgrass's work "sniveling, self-serving." But others were enthusiastic. Hayden Carruth called Mr. Snodgrass "by far the best poet to have appeared so far in this decade and probably one of the best of any age now practicing in America."

Mr. Snodgrass disliked the "confessional" label, fearing his work would be taken as a form of therapy. And as the style began to fall out of favor in the '60s, he widened his range in his follow-up book, "After Experience" (1967), and many others, commenting on religion, politics and society and finding inspiration in Impressionist paintings, the natural world and even the last days of Hitler.

In all he wrote more than 30 books of poetry, criticism and translations and taught at a number of American colleges for more than 40 years. Tall, bearded and robust, he could be blunt in his advice to students. "If you can be happy doing something else, do it," he said of poetry-writing in one interview, adding: "Everything pays better. Everything is more honestly rewarded. But if you've got to do it, then you're a life-termer."

William DeWitt Snodgrass — De (pronounced dee) to his friends — was born in Jan. 5, 1926, and grew up in Beaver Falls, Pa., the son of an accountant, Bruce, and a homemaker, Helen; Mr. Snodgrass long held her partly responsible for the death of an asthmatic sister, Barbara, at the age of 24.

After serving as a Navy typist in the Pacific during World War II and abandoning dreams of becoming a playwright, he enrolled in the Iowa workshop alongside aspiring poets like Donald Justice, William Dickey and Philip Levine. His teachers at Iowa and other workshops, besides Lowell, included some of the major poetic voices of the era, among them John Crowe Ransom, Karl Shapiro, John Berryman and Randall Jarrell.

With bachelor's and master's degrees from Iowa, he also began a long academic career, taking university teaching posts at Cornell, Rochester, Wayne State, Old Dominion, Syracuse and Delaware, from which he retired in 1994.

His most controversial work was "The Fuehrer Bunker" (1977), a heavily researched sequence of verse monologues in the voices of Nazi figures like Joseph Goebbels and Eva Braun, chronicling their last days in their Berlin bomb shelter.

To Mr. Snodgrass, it was an attempt to delve, poetically, into the minds of historical figures responsible for the most heinous event of the 20th century. But the work, though praised by Harold Bloom and others for its power and originality, came under attack. Some critics said the enormity of the subject overwhelmed the artistry and violated the poetic aesthetic. Mr. Snodgrass was accused of humanizing monsters.

Still, he adapted the work for the stage at the American Place Theater in Manhattan in 1981. The production, short-lived, drew weak reviews.

In later years he created book-length collaborations with the artist DeLoss McGraw in which poems and paintings comment on one another. In 2006 he published a well-received second volume of new and selected poems, "Not for Specialists."

Mr. Snodgrass, who lived in the same house in Erieville for 40 years, was married four times, the first three marriages ending in divorce. In addition to his wife, the former Kathleen Brown, his survivors include his daughter, Cynthia Snodgrass of Vernon, Conn; a son, Russell, of Albuquerque, N.M.; a sister, Shirley Schiemer of Beaver Falls, and a brother, Richard, of Pittsburgh.

For all the unblinking honesty he had brought to his autobiographical poems, Mr. Snodgrass chose not to write about illness in his last months. "Everybody has said everything that can be said about it," he told *The Times*. Besides, he said, he had no regrets: "I've didn't have to write anything according to anybody's dictates or desires other than my own."

But as a younger man he did write about death, in "Old Apple Trees," hearing in the "whispering" of branches the voices of elders commiserating about their last days. The poem concludes:

Not one of us got it his own way.
Nothing like any of us
Will be seen again, forever.
Each of us held some noble shape in mind.

It seemed better that we kept alive.

WD Snodgrass: American poet whose works lay at the heart of the confessional movement

In the essay that coined the label "confessional poetry", the critic ML Rosenthal concentrated on Robert Lowell's 1959 collection *Life Studies*, but *Heart's Needle* by WD Snodgrass, published the same year, was the cornerstone of the confessional movement. Snodgrass, who has died aged 83, studied under Lowell, who originally criticized his poems, saying: "You've got a brain, you can't write this kind of tear-jerking stuff."

But after portions of *Heart's Needle* were published in the landmark 1957 anthology *New Poets of England and America*, and Delmore Schwartz's widow Gertrude Buckman gave the revised book manuscript to Lowell, he was won over, arranging its publication by Knopf. How much *Heart's Needle* influenced *Life Studies* is a matter for debate (Snodgrass claimed Lowell wrote to him saying, "I'm taking you as a model"), but the books split the major awards in 1960, Snodgrass winning the Pulitzer prize and Lowell the National Book award.

Heart's Needle dealt directly with Snodgrass's own life, particularly the loss of his daughter Cynthia in a harsh custody battle with the first of his four wives. The title poem demonstrates most formidably his poetic range and power. One verse in its fifth stanza is justifiably his best-known:

Winter again and it is snowing;
Although you are still three,
You are already growing
Strange to me.

But the next stanza demonstrates Snodgrass's dramatic range. Up all night, comforting his feverish child, he tells her:

Of all things, only we
have power to choose that we should die;
nothing else is free
in this world to refuse it. Yet I,
who say this, could not raise
myself from bed how many days
to the thieving world. Child, I have another wife,
another child. We try to choose our life.

The following stanza again changes tone, its simple metaphor confirming a poetic tour de force:

Here in the scuffled dust
is our ground of play.
I lift you on your swing and must
shove you away,
see you return again,
drive you off again, then
stand quiet till you come.
You, though you climb
higher, farther from me, longer,
will fall back to me stronger.
Bad penny, pendulum,
you keep my constant time.

William De Witt Snodgrass (he was known as De, pronounced "dee") was born in Wilkesburg, Pennsylvania, and grew up in Beaver Falls. He attended nearby Geneva College but was drafted into the navy during the second world war, serving as a clerk/typist in the Pacific. After the war, he enrolled at the University of Iowa, to study theatre. Realising his plays were "lousy, and the only way they could have gotten worse was for me to do what my teacher was telling me", he switched to creative writing. Iowa's was the nation's first such programme, with teachers such as Lowell, John Berryman, Randall Jarrell, and Paul Engle. Among Snodgrass's fellow-students were Philip Levine, Robert Bly and Donald Justice.

Confessional poetry shook free of the strictures of TS Eliot and "new poetry" in order to

confront the repressions of 1950s America. Rosenthal described it as "removing of the authorial mask and revealing a series of personal confidences, rather shameful, that one is honour-bound not to reveal".

But it was Snodgrass's ability with formal structure that most impressed the British poet Peter Porter: "Snodgrass is a virtuoso, not just of versification but of his feelings. He sends them round the loops of self-analysis with the same skill he uses to corset them into his poetry." Later confessional poets such as Theodore Roethke, Sylvia Plath or Anne Sexton wrote in less formal styles. But soon formality was challenged by the beats and "projective verse" poets, while free-verse confessional became the default style of the burgeoning creative-writing industry in academe, its quality defined less by poetic virtuosity than the emotional honesty of its revelations.

Snodgrass himself taught for 40 years, most notably at Syracuse University (1968-77), and the University of Delaware (1979-94), but he satirised academe scathingly in *The Poet Ridiculed By Hysterical Academics*:

Ah, what avails the tenure race,
Ah, what the PhD,
When all departments have a place
For nincompoops like thee?

He disliked the label "confessional" and its religious overtones, and far from exposing his life in poetry, published under a number of pseudonyms, sometimes to keep publication secret from his ex-wives.

His most controversial work was *The Fuehrer Bunker*, a cycle of poems narrated by figures from the Third Reich in its dying days, published as a work in progress in 1977 and completed in 1995. Some critics felt he had gone too far, but when he uses an echo of children's verse for Magda Goebbels as she details the poisoning of her own, it makes a powerful echo of Heart's Needle. Snodgrass adapted the work for the stage in 1978, and it played off-Broadway three years later.

He published some 20 books of poetry under his own name, three books of eclectic criticism, *To Sound Like Yourself: Essays on Poetry* (2002), *De/Compositions: 101 Good Poems Gone Wrong* (2001) and *In Radical Pursuit* (1975), as well as six volumes of translation. He died in Erieville, New York, where he had lived since 1968. He is survived by his daughter Cynthia, his fourth wife, Kathleen, and a son.

Poet W.D. Snodgrass--W.D. Snodgrass, a Beaver Falls native, burst upon the American poetry scene like a comet in 1960 when his collection, "Heart's Needle," won the Pulitzer Prize and created a large following for his work.

"Nothing he published later equaled the readership of that book," said fellow poet Ed Ochester. "It was so sensational – poems that were both readable and formalist at the same time. It remains one of the finest books of 20th-century American poetry."

William DeWitt Snodgrass, 83, died Tuesday in his home near Syracuse, N.Y., in the company of his wife, Kathy, after a four-month battle with lung cancer.

Nicknamed "De," Mr. Snodgrass wrote more than 30 poetry collections and translations as well as a 1999 memoir of his life in Beaver Falls, growing up in a house across the street from Geneva College.

In "After Images: Autobiographical Sketches"(BOA Editions), he described his town:

". . . you were horizoned by the distant clamor of mills and foundries. We never heard this though, unless there was a strike and it stopped."

Mr. Snodgrass worked in those mills and briefly attended Geneva College where the strait-laced attitude of the Presbyterian school made him uncomfortable.

After serving in the Navy in World War II, he enrolled in the Iowa Writers Workshop at the University of Iowa.

After 10 years at Iowa earning several degrees but not a doctorate, he was ousted. "I was the only graduate student with tenure," Mr. Snodgrass joked at his last reading in Pittsburgh in 2005 at Pitt.

"I can't recognize either Wilkesburg or Beaver Falls anymore," he said then. "I tried to find the mill where I worked with thousands of guys, a huge place, and I couldn't."

He had earlier read here at the International Poetry Forum in 1970.

His years at Iowa proved invaluable as he studied with such poetry greats as Robert Lowell, Karl Shapiro and Randall Jarrell.

Although "Heart's Needle" brought him the label of "confessional poet," he resisted the name and worked to develop his own style.

Yet he is still viewed as "the last of the great confessional poets. With his death, a chapter closes," said Donald W. Faulkner, director of the New York State Writers Institute at SUNY Albany, a friend of the poet and a Pittsburgh native. "We've lost another Pittsburgh writer."

Mr. Faulkner said the poet wrote about "the Pittsburgh of the interior, not the Carl Sandburg view of Chicago. For De, the corridors of his interior were still part of the Pittsburgh architecture."

Michael Sims, poet and founder of Autumn House Press, a Pittsburgh-based publisher, praised Mr. Snodgrass. "He revolutionized American poetry. He personalized the American lyric the way it was never done before. He was able to write about the personal details of his life with an elegant sense of the craft."

Along with Mr. Lowell, Mr. Snodgrass started the confessional school of poetry, said the publisher. "He never liked that term, but influenced others like Sylvia Plath, Anne Sexton, Galway Kinnell and James Wright.

"There's not a single person in poetry who hasn't been influenced by Snodgrass, either following his work or in reaction to it," Mr. Sims said.

"'Heart's Needle' was a very important book in many ways, but I would never call W.D. a 'confessional poet,'" writes Sam Hamill, founder of Copper Canyon Press and an established poet. "I think a look at the book shows him to be more of a testimonial poet in 'Heart's Needle.' It remains my favorite of all his books. But his scholarship was also important to many of us."

"Heart's Needle" was published when Mr. Snodgrass was teaching at Cornell University, but he was fired "for not being academic enough, I think," said Mr. Ochester, who is editor of the Pitt Poetry Series at the University of Pittsburgh Press.

The poet then led a peripatetic academic life, serving on the faculty of several universities. He was Distinguished Professor of Creative Writing and Contemporary Poetry at the University of Delaware from 1979 until his retirement in 1994.

While Mr. Snodgrass never equaled the success of "Heart's Needle," a 1977 work brought him notoriety and a few protesters at poetry readings.

"The Fuehrer Bunker" was a collection of 20 monologues by reviled Nazi figures during the final days of the Hitler regime.

"Call it 'projectional confessionalism,'" said Mr. Faulkner. "De took up Hitler as a human being, so it was understandable that people would react in pain. It was courageous and risk-taking, but it cost him his reputation. He became classified as 'odd.' I think he was confused by the reaction."

"It was BOA's very first book," said Peter Connors, a BOA editor, "and yes, it did cause a brouhaha. Readers didn't understand that he was writing in the persona of these people."

Gradually Mr. Snodgrass faded from the poetry scene as it grew larger and more diverse.

"De kind of got lost in the world of modern poetry with its turns and fads," Mr. Faulkner said.

"He is not terribly well-known among younger poets today," said Mr. Ochester. "And he was never a self-promoter, but always a quiet guy."

BOA published Mr. Snodgrass' final book in 2006, "Not For Specialists: New and Selected Poems," that was a finalist for the National Book Critic Circle's 2007 poetry prize.

He continued to work on new poems and maintained a busy schedule of readings until he

became ill four months ago, said former student and friend Bill Patrick, a writer in Troy, N.Y.

"De was writing right up until the time he went into hospice," Mr. Patrick said, adding that his final public reading was at the Syracuse YMCA in the fall.

Along with his widow, Mr. Snodgrass is survived by a daughter, Cynthia Snodgrass of Connecticut; a son, Russell of New Mexico; sister Shirley Schiemer of Patterson Heights, Beaver County, and brother Richard of Mount Washington.

There were no funeral services.

Mr. Umberto "Bert" DeRose, 87, passed away on Thursday, November 28, 2019 with his family by his side. He was born in Amsterdam, New York, on February 7, 1932, on the birthday of his favorite novelist Charles Dickens.

Mr. DeRose was a graduate of the former Wilbur H. Lynch High School in the Class of 1949. As a student, he wrote and directed variety shows for schools' assemblies. At the age of seven he became as student of the late Augusta Canale, a local piano teacher and over the years became an accomplished pianist.

Following graduation, he attended Ithaca College and received a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1953. At Ithaca he performed in many drama productions, his favorite role was that of Polonius in Shakespeare's "Hamlet." In his senior years, he was awarded the Best Actor Award in the Annual All School Musical "Scampers." At the college, he was the President of Theta Alpha Phi, The National Dramatics Fraternity, and was a member of Kappa Gamma Psi, a musical fraternity.

Upon graduation he received a two-year teaching fellowship to Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana. At the university he taught Drama and Italian Diction. He directed theatre productions for the University and the Indianapolis Theatre Guild in the famous Hinkle Field House on campus. He also directed a musical for the Indiana Catholic Theatre Guild.

While at Butler he met the love of his life, Barbara Snodgrass of Frankfort, Indiana, who was there on a full music scholarship and was an accomplished organist. On November 19, 1955, they were married in the Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul in the City of Indianapolis.

Mr. DeRose graduated with a Master of Science Degree in Educational Administration. In that same year he returned to Amsterdam with his wife and accepted his first teaching position. He was hired by Fonda High School to teach English and Social Studies. He also served as the Drama Coach.

In 1956, he accepted an English and Social Studies teaching position with the Greater Amsterdam School District. He also began his first nine years as advisor to the student council. He chose the Ram as the school mascot and started the school's annual homecoming weekend, a tradition that continues today. Also, under the direction of DeRose's leadership, the student council raised funds to erect the Korean and Vietnam memorials that stand near the steps that lead to the school.

In 1965 he was appointed drama teacher and director and subsequently formed the Amsterdam High School Drama Club. He directed five productions a year: Children's Theatre, A Drama, The Senior Play, A Musical, and Junior Prize Speaking.

From 1949 – 1979 he served as Drama Director for the Amsterdam Recreation Commission, directing Broadway musicals. It was noted that he was the first director to cast teenagers in musical theatre productions in upstate New York. He also directed annual musicals for the Cudmore-Wassel Memorial and Scholarship Fund. Over his theatrical career, he directed 172 productions.

In 1966 began his administrative career with the district, with his appointment to Building Administrative Assistant and Assistant Principal to John Varoske of Wilbur H. Lynch High School. In that same years he was made coordinator of one the first teach aide programs in the state. From 1967 to 1971 he serves as assistant high school principal and from 1971 to 1986 he shared the duties of associate principal with his good friend Claude Palczak. He served as head principal at the present Amsterdam High School from 1986 until 1995.

Following his retirement, then Amsterdam Mayor Mario Villa proclaimed September 29, 1995, as Bert DeRose Day in Amsterdam. During his career he received a number of citations from the NYS Assembly and Senate as well as the House of Representatives in Washington. He was also an honorary member of the Amsterdam Parent-Teachers Association and the Knights of Columbus. In 2016 he was elected to the Hall of Fame of the Amsterdam School District. In July of 1997, the school district named the Amsterdam High School Auditorium, The Umberto "Bert" DeRose Auditorium in his honor.

Through the years he was affiliated with St. Anthony Society of Mt. Carmel Church, a charter member of Phi Delta Kappa at Butler University, National Secondary Principal Association, The Secondary Administrators Association of New York State, The Retired Teachers Association of New York State and Amsterdam, The Amsterdam Administrators Association, and The Amsterdam Teachers Association. Mr. DeRose also served on committees with the Boy Scouts of America, The United Way, CYO, and was an advisor to registrants of the Selective Service System.

Mr. DeRose also served a time as President of the Mt. Carmel Church Council. He enjoyed serving as Lector and as a Eucharistic Minister at the church. He also served a time on the Board of Directors for the Montgomery County Office For Aging and as President of the PTA at R.J. McNulty Elementary School. For a time, he taught speech classes at FMCC.

Mr. DeRose enjoyed oil painting, cooking, working in his flower beds, and decorating the outside of his home during the various holidays. He always looked forward to vacations with his family to Maine; Cape Cod; Williamsburg; Charleston, South Carolina; Nashville; Canada; and many trips to visit family in Frankfort, Indiana. He also looked forward to the annual summer reunions with many of his former drama students who came together to reminisce their theatre experiences as performers in DeRose Productions. He always called them his "Drama Kids."

Following his retirement, Mr. DeRose was called upon to serve as Interim Principal at R. J. McNulty and Currie East Side Schools. For a number of years, he went to various elementary schools to read to their students and was often called upon to be a guest speaker at AHS class

reunions, something he enjoyed very much. In the summer of 2019, members of the community and former students came together to honor Mr. DeRose, with a special production, something he enjoyed immensely.

He was predeceased by his parents, James and Anna (Pagliaro) DeRose; and one brother, Ralph DeRose. Survivors include his wife Barbara; his children of whom he was most proud, Rev. Martin James DeRose, Michele (Brian) MacShane, Matthew (Johanna) DeRose; seven loving grandchildren, Tanya (Matthew) Keenan, Matthew (Lisa) DeRose, Justin MacShane, Chantelle DeRose, Shane DeRose, Marcus DeRose and Cheyanne DeRose; four beautiful great grandchildren, Aubree, Zoe, Madison and James; a sister-in-law, Helen DeRose; nieces, nephews and cousins.

Breese then identified the photograph, which the Lieutenant produced.

"When I read the newspaper accounts four days later," said the conductor, "I felt certain this was the girl. There was only one sleeper on the train that night, because we had taken off the Toronto car. We began taking tickets just after leaving High Bridge, and when we came to this young woman, she said: 'I want a ticket to Cleveland, and a berth, too, if you have it.' Later she told the porter she was looking for a position as a trained nurse, either in Cleveland or Chicago, though she would rather go to Cleveland.

"She got off at Cleveland, and of course we have not seen her since. This morning was the first time I have been in New York since reading of the case, and I came directly to the police."

Rev. Benjamin [should be James] Snodgrass (father of Rev. W. D. Snodgrass) was born in Doylestown, Pennsylvania; graduated at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, and studied divinity under Rev. Dr. Sproat, pastor of the Second Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia. He settled in West Hanover, Dauphin Co., Pennsylvania, in 1784, where he remained pastor of the church until his death, which occurred in 1846.

His wife, Martha Davis, of Philadelphia (the mother of Rev. W. D. Snodgrass), was a successful helpmeet of her husband in matters pertaining to his pastoral work. She had six children who survived the period of infancy. One of the daughters became the wife of a clergyman, and another became the mother of three ministers, of whom was the Rev. Asbel Green Simonton, who went as missionary to Brazil, was the founder of the first Presbyterian Church in Rio [de] Janeiro, and died in early life, greatly lamented by the church generally.

The subject of this sketch [William D. Snodgrass] was the youngest but one of the six children, and was born on 30 Jun 1796. His parents bestowed upon him much care and solicitude in regard to his mental training, and as a result he resolved to devote himself to the service of Christ in the work of the gospel ministry. With this view, he remained in his father's family, attending a select school in the neighborhood, where the usual branches of an English education were taught. At the age of 14, he began the study of Greek and Latin, under the tuition of the Rev. James Sharon, pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Derry, Dauphin Co., PA.

In the fall of 1812 he entered the sophomore class in Washington College, PA, graduated in 1815, receiving the first honors of his class; studied Hebrew under the tuition of Rev. James R. Wilson, then of Philadelphia; entered the theological seminary at Princeton in the summer of 1816, passing through the entire course of study, and in the fall of 1818 appeared before the Presbytery of Carlisle, and entered on the usual trials for licensure to preach the gospel. After leaving the seminary he filled an appointment from the Young Men's Missionary Society of New York for the period of Six months, in the section of country lying south of the James River, and between Norfolk and Petersburg, VA.

At the request of Dr. Alexander, visited the Presbyterian Church of Fayetteville, NC, afterwards receiving a call to be its pastor; was ordained to the work of the gospel ministry; installed pastor by the Presbytery of Fayetteville 30 Jul 1819.

During the winter of 1822 received a call to the Independent Presbyterian Church of Savannah, GA (Rev. Dr. Kollock's, deceased). Filled this pulpit until the summer of 1823, when he received a call from the Session of the Murray Street Church, New York (Rev. Dr. Mason). Arrived in New York Aug 1823 and was installed pastor by the Presbytery of New York the same year.

Married, 9 Dec 1823 to Miss Charlotte H. Moderwell, of Lancaster, PA, a niece of William Kirkpatrick, of the same place, who was an elder of the Presbyterian Church, who had superintended her education in the seminary under the care of Mr. Judson, in Philadelphia, and who was an active and liberal friend to all Christian institutions and interests.

The above pastorate continued for about 10 years, during which time (in the year 1826) the degree of Doctor of Divinity was conferred upon him by Columbia College. After leaving the Murray Street Church, he was elected and served as assistant secretary of the Board of Domestic Missions for the period of about 2 years, the field of labor being in the States of New York and New Jersey; after which was called to the pastorate of the Second Street Presbyterian Church, in Troy <Rensselaer Co.>, and installed as its pastor 3 Oct 1834, for the period of about 10 years. In the spring of 1844 called to found the new church built by Mr. James Lennox, in 15th St. between Irving Place and Third Ave.; installed its pastor 15 Mar 1845, laboring in building up this (then) waste place for 5 years, besides serving as a member of the Executive Committee of the Board of Foreign Missions.

Received a call in the summer of 1849 to the Presbyterian Church in Goshen <Orange Co.>, NY, made vacant by the resignation of the Rev. Roberet McCartee, D.D.; pastoral relation with the church in New York dissolved by Presbytery 8 Oct 1849; installed by the Presbytery of Hudson on 7 Nov 1849, preaching his inauguration sermon on the ensuing Sabbath. From the

date of the beginning of this pastorate up to the present time has faithfully fulfilled all of its requirements, passing through scenes of the Spirit's quickening power, dedicating a new church, celebrating his golden wedding, witnessing the leveling and raising of the church steeple, and at a green old age of 85 fulfilling acceptably with an assistant all the duties and requirements of a full pastorate, and patiently witing for that last summons to "go up higher."

His grandfather, James Snodgrass, whose parents came from the north of Ireland about 1700, settled in Doylestown, Bucks Co., PA. There his father <sic>, James Snodgrass, was born in 1761.

The adopted son of Fred and Lola Snodgrass, Clyde William Snodgrass was born and raised in the Seattle, [King Co.] Washington, area. He graduated from Auburn High School in 1947. With no means for a college education immediately at his disposal, Clyde enlisted in the Army in June 1947. He completed basic training and entered artillery training. Shortly after the start of his artillery training, a sergeant asked if anyone was interested in entering West Point [Military Academy, West Point, **Orange Co., New York**], and Clyde raised his hand. In his dry style, he was fond of relating that his next step was with the Post psychiatrist for an interview. Following courses at the USMA Prep School as a Pfc, Clyde entered the Academy with the Class of '52 on July 1, 1948.

Clyde was one of those who had a love affair with flying from an early age. He drew pictures of airplanes, built models, spent hard-earned money on airplane carnival rides, and volunteered to be a plane spotter during World War II. That love affair blossomed at West Point as he discovered “space A” travel and became adept at finding hops to a series of adventures. On one of those flights in 1950, the Fairchild C-82 “Flying Boxcar” he was hitching a ride on lost both engines, and Clyde had to bail out near Tallahassee, Florida, qualifying him for membership in the Caterpillar Club. At the Point, he participated in the Radio Club and Rifle, but was principally known for his ability to find humor in any situation, for his battles with the Academic Board, and for his yearning for a wing of silver on a field of blue.

Upon graduation with the Class of 1952 on June 3, 1952, Clyde was commissioned a second lieutenant in the United States Air Force. He entered primary training at Bainbridge Air Force Station, Georgia, in August, flying the North American T-6. His West Point roommate was lost in a mid-air collision at the end of that training, and he escorted the body to Cleveland for the funeral, and then traveled on to New York for his wedding to Margaret Terrio.

After basic flight training in T-28s and T-33s at Bryan, Texas, Clyde earned his coveted pilot wings in August 1953 and reported to Tyndall AFB for advanced training in the F-86D interceptor. Assignments followed flying his beloved F-86F out of Dow AFB, Maine, and later Stewart AFB, New York. In later years, the sight of static display Sabre jets always brought nostalgia and remarks about the indignity of “birds on sticks.” During the latter assignment, daughter Susan joined the Snodgrass flight, appropriately born in the West Point Hospital in May 1954.

In 1955 Clyde traveled alone to Chitose Air Base in Hokkaido, Japan, standing alert against repeated Russian incursions into Japanese territories. In the spring of 1956, recurring respiratory difficulties resulted in permanent removal from flying duties and assignment to the Air Base Group Headquarters Squadron. His family arrived in May, and in February 1957 Steven Snodgrass was born.

Reorienting to Air Force life without flying was a challenge for Clyde. Tours followed at Fuchu Air Station, Tokyo, Japan; in the Intelligence Division of HQ, 15th Air Force, at Maxwell AFB, Alabama; and at SAC HQ in the 544th Reconnaissance Technical Wing. In April 1965

Clyde was assigned as Commander TUSLOG Detachment 47, and the family based in Istanbul, Turkey, while Clyde made frequent trips managing postal and courier services from Germany to Pakistan.

In 1967 Clyde joined the Minuteman ICBM force at Whiteman AFB, Missouri. He qualified as a launch officer, led the squadron command post, was promoted to a squadron operations officer billet, and ultimately commanded the 509th Strategic Missile Squadron. After command of the 509th, Clyde was assigned successively as Chief, Wing Plans and Intelligence Division; and Chief, Wing Standardization & Evaluation Division. While at Whiteman, he earned his MBA from the University of Missouri.

Clyde's final Air Force posting was at Headquarters, 4th Air Division at Fairchild AFB, Washington. Lieutenant Colonel Clyde Snodgrass retired in August 1975 after 28 years of service. His personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal and the Air Force Commendation Medal with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters.

In retirement, Clyde had a second career for 18 years at Western Washington University in Bellingham, Washington. Starting as the Manager of Custodial Services in 1976, he progressed to become the Plant Services Manager, responsible for all aspects of physical plant operations and maintenance, as well as the printing plant, safety, and Campus Police. He retired from WWU in 1994.

On May 20, 2000, Clyde married his second wife, Virginia Louise Snodgrass, a musician from Bellingham, Washington. Virginia and Clyde were a happy match. They split time between residences in Big Piney Key, [Monroe Co.] Florida, and Bellingham, [Whatcom Co.] Washington, and enjoyed traveling together. Clyde remained active particularly enjoying gardening, his daily bicycle rides, and his constant battle with the big green iguanas in Florida. One of his joyful discoveries was to track down his birth parents and find that he had living siblings in Fargo, North Dakota, who welcomed him with open arms. Several trips and many phone calls ensued, and Clyde found comfort at being with folks that looked and sounded like him, and in catching up on family history.

Clyde is survived by his wife, Virginia Snodgrass; his daughter, Susan Keuhlen; his son, Steven Snodgrass; and several grandchildren. His remains were laid to rest in the USMA Columbarium.

The funeral was held Friday at three o'clock at St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church, the officiating clergyman being the Rev. William Tripp of Richford. Mr. Snodgrass was a member of Lincoln Lodge, No. 78, F. & A. M., Enosburg, and the funeral was held under Masonic auspices, the members of the lodge being well represented. Mr. Snodgrass is survived by his wife, two daughters, and two sons by a former marriage.

St. Albans Weekly Messenger (Saint Albans, Vermont) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 26 Sep 1918:

The funeral of Alec Snodgrass, who died Wednesday, September 18, was held in St. Bartholomew's church Friday afternoon. The Rev. James Tripp, of Richford, officiated. The bearers were John Fountain, N. S. Parker, C. A. Gardyne, and C. T. Hall. Among those from out of town who attended the funeral were Mr. Bedell, of Burlington; Mr. and Mrs. O. N. Kelton, of St. Albans; Mrs. B. H. Dickenson, of Enosburg Falls; and Mr. and Mrs. Fred Snodgrass, of Waterloo, Que. Montgomery has again been saddened by the death of another well-known resident. Mrs. Kathyryne Snodgrass has been in poor health for some years and about two weeks ago grew much worse and last Thursday night passed away. The late Mrs. Snodgrass was the daughter of Robert and Margaret Logan, of North Shefford, P. Q. She was married in 1893 to the late Alexander Snodgrass, by whom she had two daughters, Mrs. Galbraith, of Granby, P. Q., and Miss Pearl Snodgrass. The funeral Service took place in the Episcopal Church, the Rev. W. J. M. Beattie officiating, the singing being led by a quartet composed of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Parker, Mrs. Dean Scott, and Natt Parker. Mrs. N. S. Parker played the organ. The burial was in a local graveyard. Besides a large number of friends and neighbors, there were present from out of town Mrs. and Mrs. Galbraith, of Granby, Matthew Logan, of Waterloo, a brother, and Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Purdy, of Richford.

St. Albans Weekly Messenger (Saint Albans, Vermont) (Newspapers.com), Thursday, 17 Mar 1921:

Mrs. Kate (Logan) Snodgrass died at her home here Thursday evening, March 10, of sugar diabetes. The funeral was held at St. Bartholomew's church Saturday afternoon, the Rev. W. J. M. Beattie, of East Berkshire, officiating. The Methodist choir sang two selections. The bearers were: Herbert Galbraith, of Granby; Alton Purdy, of Richford; the Rev. Allen Kirkness and Delton Sweet, of this place.

Mrs. Snodgrass is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Herbert Galbraith and Miss Pearl Snodgrass; and one brother, Matthew Logan of Waterloo, Que. Mrs. Snodgrass would have been 61 years of age had she lived until May. She was a communicant of St. Bartholomew's church.
