Campbell said they were prity fellows to send here for taxes; but he would call a Committee and prevent the paying of taxes till such times as they would pay what they were endue us, or endue to the County, or words to that import.

This Deponent further sayeth, that when the Governor's proclamation was produced to the Court of Washington, Colo. Campbell objected against it, and said the Court had no right to pay any regard to it, and that the Governor had no right to issue such a proclamation. Sworn to before us the 23d day of Feb'y, 1786, as Witness our hands and Seals.

[James Lee Snodgrass: This transferred 6/7 of the 1/5th share of the John Snodgrass property which Edward Lee inherited and which he later deeded to his wife Florence and their children. The other four 1/5th shares had been to Florence, Ollie, Ina, and James Goolman. The 6/7 share of the 1/5 was in the names of six of the seven children of Edward Lee and since the heir of Olga, Cecil Ray, had not signed, that meant only the six surviving children of Edward Lee who were Thelma, John Henry, Paul, Elsie, Edward and the mother Florence could agree. This very long and detailed deed ties the parents of James Lee Snodgrass who are John and Bessie Snodgrass as children of Florence and E. L. Snodgrass and further stated that E. L. was an heir of John Snodgrass. The brothers and sisters of John Henry Snodgrass are listed as well as the children of John Snodgrass who was the father of E. L. Snodgrass. Three generations are neatly combined here in one document. Earl Clayton Ray did not sell his share until 16 May 1960 Deed Book 181, page 474. This transactions must have been the realization to John Henry that he would never achieve his dream of purchasing and living at the old home in Hubbard Springs. Land transactions and deaths seemed to appear together as soon after these mid April sales James Goolman died, an apparent suicide.]

HUBBARD SPRINGS, Va.--The village of Hubbard Springs, nestled at the foot of Cumberland Mountain in a remote section of Lee County, may have been the first attempt to establish a "health center" in Lee County and possibly the first in Virginia.

An old timer, John Snodgrass, acquired the property known as Hubbard Springs and proceeded to develop it as a health center to treat "stomach trouble" with water from the springs in 1903.

Snodgrass initially owned property in Nebraska which he sold and purchased a two room log house and property supporting 22 springs. Seven of the springs located near the log house spouted "mineral" water.

According to Mrs. Roy Lucas, a granddaughter of Snodgrass, he built a 14 room "hotel" from the two-room log facility and proceeded to develop the area by building a boardwalk to the springs.

Mrs. Glessye Humphreys, a native of Hubbard Springs, who now resides in Jonesville, said, "Beginning at Mr. Snodgrass's house (or hotel), there were seven springs real close together and all had different kinds of water."

There was white, black and yellow sulphur along with mineral and iron water within a radius of 10 feet, according to Mrs. Humphreys. Mrs. Lucas named iron, limestone and freestone water at the springs also.

Mrs. Humphreys said that Snodgrass built a nice boardwalk to the seven springs and enclosed them with a rock wall. Along the boardwalk sheds were built with benches inside. The boardwalk served all the springs.

The property was a five acre tract and the springs were named for Eli Hubbard who acquired the property about 1860, according to Mr. and Mrs. Howard Ledford, natives of the Hubbard Springs area.

Mrs. Lucas said her grandfather, John Snodgrass, was born in Washington County, Virginia, April 16, 1842, and died in September of 1906. She said he built the hotel in 1903. After the death of Snodgrass, the hotel began to deteriorate and Mr. and Mrs. Ledford were residents there for several years.

Ledford said that someone apparently set fire to the old building in 1976, destroying it. Now, the lot is cleared of the debris and the springs are still flowing but they are in a "rundown condition." They reportedly are owned by a Laura Wilder of Portsmouth, GA.

Mrs. Humphreys said that people would come from far and near to drink the water from the Hubbard Springs. She said they hauled water from the springs by wagons and shipped some by railroad. People would come to Hubbard by train and board at the Snodgrass Hotel and drink water for their "stomach troubles."

Ledford said, "We went over the old house the night it burned and watched. It sure was a pitiful sight to see the old logs burn."

Ledford said that the Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company named their train stop for the Hubbard Springs. Eli Hubbard acquired the land from Louisville Land Co.

In the days of the Snodgrass Hotel, Hubbard Springs was accessible primarily by the L & N Railroad Company with four passenger trains daily. Now, there are several paved roads serving the area.

Route 621 leads from 421 at Pennington Gap to Hubbard Springs and Route 659 leads down Sugar Run with 656 branching off to Hubbard Springs.

This is where they farmed and built their home on land given to Henry by his parents--Samuel, b. 14 Oct 1854, d. Oct 1922 and Sarah Dean Dingus, b. 11 Nov 1854, d. 17 Sep 1939. Henry was the grandson of William and Lucy Stallard Dingus. William was a Methodist minister.

Henry enjoyed sitting on the front porch reading his daily newspaper and talking with neighbors as they passed by. He quit farming and rented his land after his son, Bruce, joined the army. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge Fidelity No. 173 for over 50 years.

His brothers and sisters were: William, Lucy, Nathan, Ella, Mattie, Lawrence, and Charles.

Lucy was the daughter of Johnny and Louvenia Snodgrass Cox. She enjoyed cooking and sewing for her family, making beautiful quilts and needlework.

Lucy and Henry boarded school teachers in their home. Some of those were: Wanda Horne, Lona Gillenwater, and Elsie Stapleton Welch. Funerals were sometimes held in the Dingus home and then burial would take place in the Dingus Family cemetery on the farm. Lucy's funeral was held at her home. She was buried in the family cemetery, but was later moved to Holston View beside of Henry.

3rd I give to my two daughters Mary Wills and Jean Coffield Each I gave one Milch Cows next choice after their Mother out of my stock of cattle.

Also my will is my son Robert stands indebted to me the sum of seventeen dollars and fifty cents that he be exhonerated from the payment of the same on his paying six dollars to my son John.

4th to each of my children Martha, William, James, & Catherine, David & Margaret I give and bequeath to Each five shillings And futher my will is that as my two sons Joseph and Benjamin enjoy the whole of my lands that each shall be equal shares in the use of the barn until such times as they may see proper to make other arrangements.

Lastly all the rest of my estates both real & personal of whatsoever kind it may be not herein particularly disposed of I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin to him and his heirs forever. Also I do hereby constitute and appoint my son James as my Executor to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former wills and testaments heretofore made. hire of said negro to go to the benefit of my wife, the remaining two thirds to be equally divided amongst my daughters, if she is continued in possession of my wife and she continues to live with my son William they shall be entitled to the benefit of her labour until the decease of my wife, and finally at her decease said negro and issue shall be sold and the money arising from the sale to be equally divided amongst my three daughters and should any of my three daughters wish to purchase her they shall be allowed two years to make payment provided they are willing to give a price for her as much as can be got from another, if she is sold to a stranger my executors shall make the terms of sale as they shall see proper and divide the money as above mentioned.

2nd My Will is that my two sons John and Joseph shall have the tract of land they now live on, to be equally divided between them having regard to quality and quantity leaving it to them to make such division as may suit best, in case they disagree in said division they shall refer same to three or more disinterested men to make such division whose judgement shall be final, and each shall be entitled to the moiety assigned him henceforth and forever, in case each of them pay one hundred & fifty dollars in property at a fair marked price which may be discharged in horses, cattle or grain of any kind, which payment shall be made in two years after my decease the one half, or 150 dollars worth to my son David Snodgrass or his heirs, the remaining 150 to be equally divided amongst my three daughters.

3d My Will is that my son Abram shall have the east end of the tract of land I live on including my three lower fields the fence dividing the three lower fields from the upper part to conduct the division line across the place until it intersects with the line of the place devised to John and Joseph which tract or parcel of land shall be his henceforth and enjoyed by him and his heirs forever. The remaining part of my land I give and bequeath to my son William, likewise my waggon and harness, my farming utensils and implements of husbandry which shall remain his henceforth and be enjoyed by him and his heirs forever. And further my will is that all my estate not herein particularly specified (consist in what it may) including my live stock of all kinds shall be appraised and sold and the money arising from the sale of whatever may remain (after making a sufficient allowance of provision for the support of my family during 12 months) likewise all cash that may become due on bonds in my possession shall be equally divided amongst my three daughters, to wit, Jenny Orr, Polly Eakin and Eleanor Hutton.

And Lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son John Snodgrass and my son in law John Eakin Executors to this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking and making void all others. disposed as hereafter directed as far as it relates to her third of my personal estate, my will is that my wife shall have the liberty to dispose of at her decease as she may think best and over and above her third part of my personal estate I give and bequeath to her my negro girl named Ann and finally to dispose of at her decease as she may think proper also the sole use of my negro Hannah during her natural life.

2d I give to my son James in Tennessee in addition to what he has already received, all my interest or share in a wool carding machine now in possession of William Jones in Washington County Tennessee who is proprietor of one half of the same.

3d I give to my son William in Tennessee the one half of a tract of land in Carter County Tennessee containing 97½ acres which I had heretofore entered in the name of David & William Snodgrass joining lines with William & Doran Vothers in addition to what he has already received.

4th I give to my daughter Elizabeth Walker of Tennessee my negro girl named Eleanor in addition to what she has already received to her & her heirs forever.

5th I give to my son Thomas my one half share of five tracts of land on the Laurel fork of Holstein in Carter County Tennessee to wit William Gentry tract, two tracts known by the name of the Burnt Cabbins tracts, one called the forge tract and one the tanyard tract likewise all my right or share in the forge & tanyard (reserving the one half of the real profits of the tanyard for my familys use to the end of the present year) I also give him all my shares and interest in all ore banks of whatever description, my negro girl named Phebe also two milch cows & calves out of my stock of cattle on the Laurel fork, my two sorrel filleys & sorrel mare, all the stock of hogs and household and kitchen furniture, farming utensils &c that he has in possession on s'd Laurel fork, my new road waggon now at the smith shop, when finished fit for use &c.

6th I give to my two sons Samuel M. and Joseph I give the tract of land I possess in Washington County Va. also my share in two tracts of land on the Laurel fork not devised called the Benj. Gentry tract and the Poindexter tract, also my two negro men Jacob and Mark (or if Jacob is sold, the money arising from the sale), my negro woman named Hannah at my wifes decease and her child Peggy and all the issue or increase (if any) that she may yet have, all my livestock of whatever kind including Horses, cattle, sheep & hogs, not otherwise disposed of, two thirds of all the debts yet to collect, except a debt due me from the estate of Sam'l Meek dec'd, all manufactured iron, farming utensils of every description and finally my will is that my estate not herein particularly specified and disposed of of whatever kind shall descend to my two sons Samuel M. and Joseph jointly each holding an equal share leaving it to them to make a division as may suit them hereafter.

This lease shall not be transferable to any other person whatever. Also my desire is that within one year after my decease, a horse of the value of fifty dollars, in trade, be paid to his son John. And to his two sons Alexander and Francis, and to his daughter Rebecca, each a young heifer not exceeding two years old, out of my stock of cattle. My son James D. shall also have the cordings and other fixing belonging to coverlid weaving except the loom & reeds.

3dly My Will is that my daughter Rebecca shall have my dun horse with her saddle & bridle, her bureau, spinning wheel, one third of all my beds, bedsteds and furniture, one half of my cupboard and one third of my kitchen furniture, my coverlid loom and all tackling belonging to plain weaving, three head of milch cattle, the one half of my flock of sheep, and sixty dollars in cash, and she shall also have her living and pasture & keeping for her horse as long as she

remains in the family.

4thly My Will is that my three sons Joseph, Francis and Alexander, hold for them and their heirs equal shares in what land I possess: which shall nevertheless be subject to the maintainance and comfortable support of my son David, and which no conveyance shall disanull or make void, neither shall any of my three sons sell or convey his interest in the land to any person during the lifetime of my son David, unless they shall first give such security to my Executors as they shall approve, for his comfortable maintainance, to the amount of the value of the part so conveyed. Excepting however that one sell to the other which they may do at any time they see proper. I also give my three sons before named, equal shares in all my farming utensils, my still and still vessels, tools of every kind including my new waggon, gears &c. also each of my four sons now at home to have the horse he already claims, and Joseph and Francis to have the grey yearling colt jointly between them. And to my son Alexander I give my negro boy named Campbell, at his mothers decease, provided he pay within four years from the time the said negro boy becomes his property, the sum of two hundred dollars in the following manner, to wit, to my son William within one year after his mothers decease, sixty dollars in cash. And to my son Francis within two years after the decease of his mother Forty dollars one half in cash and the other half in trade or good property. And to Joseph Forty dollars one half in cash and the other half in good property within three years. And the remaining sixty dollars to be paid within four from the period above mentioned, one half to my son Thomas and the other half to my daughter Rebecca one half to each in cash and the other half in good property. provided however that if the said negro boy should by accident, decease or infirmity become disabled, then, and in that case it is my will that he Alexander shall be exonerated from the payments aforesaid: but he shall be liable for his maintainance and support and shall also learn him to read. And it is also my desire that if said negro boy should become disabled at any time within the four years above mentioned, that any payment Alex'r may have made, may be refunded to him. And farther it is my will and desire that if any of my four sons now at home should decease without lawful issue before any sale or conveyance of his part of the land take place; that his share be equally divided among the remaining three, after giving to my sone William one fifth part, and so on should more of them decease.

5thly I desire that whatever remains due of the principal of Wm. D. Jones' note to me, be equally divided between my son William and Wm. D. Jones, without interest on any part of it. Also I give to my son William my silver watch in addition to other devises.

6thly My Will is that my three sons Joseph, Francis and Alexander fulfil the requirements of the Indenture of the negro girl and negro boy bound to me by the overseers of the poor.

7thly I give to my daughter Polly Stewart Twenty five dollars.

8thly I desire that all debts to collect, or property not particularly specified, or whatever remains undevised of my estate, shall be at the disposal of my wife excepting the horse devised to my grandson John Snodgrass, which I require her to pay.

9thly All of my estate may be appraised, but no sale, except my executors with the consent of my wife think best to sell part. And as my estate is in no way involved, I humbly pray the court to require no more security than the nett amount of the estate. And lastly, I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son Thomas and Samuel M. Snodgrass executors of this my last Will and Testament making void all others by me heretofore made, as before mentioned. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 11th day of May in the year of our Lord 1830.

A certificate is therefore granted them for the administration of the estate of William Snodgrass

Sen'r deceased with the Will annexed in due form.

Only Major Indian Battle of Area Holds Significant Place in History
By Gordon Aronhime.

Nearly everyone knows our militia fought a fierce battle with the Indians at the Long Island Flats in 1776, but almost no one knows of the sequel to it, which was fought near Kennedy's Mill nine days later.

This latter battle, in which all the Indians fighting except one were killed or drowned, was the only Indian battle fought on the Holston north of the present Tennessee line.

But it has another and more important significance. In the chain that eliminated the threat of danger from the Cherokee Indians for the next three years, there were three links. The Flats Battle was the first link, and the Cherokee campaign of Colonel William Christian in the fall of 1776 was the final link. The Battle of Kennedy's Mill was the central link.

After the Battle of Long Island Flats on 20 Jul 1776, most of the 150 militiamen who had participated either went back to their homes, or, as was more often the case, into neighborhood forts near their homes.

A chain of these forts extended down the Holston, but our account is only concerned with four. They are Black's Fort (the present Abingdon), Bryant's Fort (the junction of present U.S.

11 and route 694), Snodgrass's Fort (the present Bucky Hutton Home, actually the very building, on route 735 near the River), and Kincannon's Fort (the junction of today's U.S. 11 and Route 91).

The other forts in present Washington County were, like those in Sullivan and Smyth Counties of today, too far away to be of use in this encounter.

History books, such as they are, do not mention this small, but significant battle. Fortunately, however, documents have been preserved which give a full history of the encounter. The account here is drawn from nine such documents. All of these are either contemporary states, or were written by men who had actually participated in the event many years after its occurrence.

Three are letters by the redoubtable Colonel William Snodgrass, written three years before his death in 1848, and who at the time of the letters was age 85. His mind was clear, his memory superb, and his account unexceptionable, though 70 years had elapsed since the event.

Two letters used are from Colonel William Russell, reporting events from his military post at Fort Chiswell to Colonel William Preston, then the military commander of Fincastle County. There is a letter from Preston to the council of Virginia, and two pension statements by participants are used. In addition, there is a 1776 newspaper account, certainly the first and probably the last until this one.

The earliest statement of the situation comes in a letter by Colonel Russell to Preston on 25 Jul 1776. Russell writes, "The Indians have got up Holston as far as Captain [James] Montgomery's [the site of present Green Spring] and burnt all waist houses before them. They killed Matt Rowbottom [who lived on the Holston near the present State line] and another man got wounded since the Battle." (By the "Battle," Russell means the Battle of Long Island Flats five days earlier than the date of his letter.)

Around the same time, Colonel Preston wrote to the President of the Council of Virginia, the true governing body of the new State, the following words in a letter that was certainly vivid: "Since then, the enemy have got up to near the head of Holston, are burning all waste houses, destroying fields of grain of every kind, killing and driving off stock, and murdering any of the inhabitants that fall in their way. The people in that quarter are, I believe, all in forts, and such is the scarcity of ammunition that by a letter from Major [Anthony] Beldsoe, I find that near 400 souls are confined in a fort at Captain Shelby's."

Prior to this sequence of events, Colonel Arthur Campbell, Preston's resident deputy military commander, had ordered that spies be kept out at all daylight hours from all the forts. Black's Fort, the largest in the area except Shelby's and full to the brim, like Shelby's at the time, sent out spies as did all the others.

Captain Andrew Colville was in command there and on this Sunday, July 28th, he was very apprehensive. He had just heard that spies from Snodgrass's fort, up the river, had been chased back to the fort itself by a strong party of Indians.

The day was a typical one in the pattern of July weather in our area. It was very hot, sultry, and hazy, and there were occasional thunderstorms of considerable violence. The six spies had set out in pairs that morning early, carrying their meager rations, ammunition and guns. It was nearing time for them to have been back, but there was no sign of them.

Though apprehensive in the afternoon because the spies had not begun to return, Colville also had reason to rejoice for a small shipment of ammunition, consisting of gunpowder, lead, and gun cotton, had arrived the evening before, so that the plight of the frontiersmen was not so desperate. But why had the spies not returned? Colville waited, anxious and impatient.

The blood-red sun finally disappeared in the western hills and the twilight deepened. Still the spies had not returned. The wife of one of them, not long since married, began to silently weep. Soon, darkness was complete, and still the spies had not returned. Captain Colville thought about the near fatal mishap of the spies from Snodgrass's fort the day before.

Suddenly, there was a noise at the gate, and a shout went up from the hundreds inside the fort. The spies had returned!

The gates swung open and there were all six of the men, looking very jubilant and excited. Soon Captain Colville found out they had good reason for their excitement.

The spies had discovered the camp of the Indians. It was on the north side of the Holston, not too far from William Kennedy's mill, the best-known of the Holston mills at that time. It was only instinct to act immediately. But Andrew Colville, though not a very smart man, was a wise one. Long experience on the frontier had taught him what native intelligence could not supply. So he made no attack on the savages until morning.

However, Colville was not altogether inactive. He sent out men to each of the forts nearest the scene--Bryant's, Snodgrass's, Kincannon's. He urged them to spare as many men as could be had without leaving the women and children unprotected, and to meet at a designated place before dawn.

We are not told where they met, but we can guess it was Kennedy's Mill, and we know they did meet. He also sent a special messenger, an "express" as it was then called, to Fort Chiswell, 80 miles away, to inform Russell so he could inform Preston.

On the next day--Monday, 29 Jul 1776--Colonel Russell, having been given the news by the "express," wrote to Colonel Preston: "The Indians are advancing fast up the river, are now in number about the settlement of the Edmistsons [Edmondsons]. Forty are encamped just below Kennedy's Mill, who, I hope will be attacked by one hundred of our men this morning."

Colonel David Snodgrass, in a letter written to Governor David Campbell late in August of 1845 recalled: "The news came to my father's fort in the night. All the men that could be spared from guarding the women and children went on immediately and met the men from the other forts."

Pension statements of both Leton Smith and James Keys tell of this event. Smith, born in 1760 and thus, like Colonel Snodgrass, then only 16, swore in court in Bledsoe Co., TN, in Feb 1833: "... previous to the expedition of Col. Christian, while stationed at the fort of Joseph Black's, the spies who were out from the fort brought news one evening after dark that a company of Indians were in the neighborhood. The forces started out from the fort, declarant being along, travelled all night."

James Keys, who lived near present Damascus, appeared in court at Abingdon the day before Christmas in 1833 and made his declaration for a Revolutionary Pension. He told how he had been in Captain James Thompson's company at the Flats Battle on 20 Jul 1776.

He continued, "He was at home but a short time when the county was invaded by a strong party of Indians committing many murders and other depredations on the frontier settlements. He was ordered out with a party from Bryant's [Bryant's] Fort and joined another party from Black's Fort."

The Indians were totally unaware of the impending attack. There exists a newspaper account, as mentioned previously. This appeared in the Maryland Gazette of 20 Aug 1776 and is quoted in full here:

"Monday the 29th [of July] that 100 of our rangers fell in with a party of the Cherokees, who had penetrated 50 miles on this side of the Big Island and were busy skinning a beef at a deserted plantation; that our people killed five of the savages and took prisoner one who was mortally wounded and made prize of twenty rifles belonging to the party."

At the end of this article, for the benefit of those who might wish to see the actual site of Kennedy's Mill and of the Battlefield, directions are given in full.

The troops had no need for directions, for they knew the area well. They marched silently down the road designated route 707 by the Virginia Department of Highways. Travellers taking this route today can get a true sense of history, for not much improvement has been made on this road in the past two centuries, it is feared.

Arriving on the scene, the troops came across--as noted in the 1776 newspaper account--the group of Indians busily skinning a beef they intended to cook and eat. Their firearms were stacked neatly nearby. They had no scouts or sentries posted.

Note that both the newspaper account and Colonel Russell gave the number of Indians as 40, but the accounts by the soldiers who took part all agree on the number of Indians as being 24 or 25. Unlike the newspaper account, those who were in the battle and left later accounts all agreed that every Indian, except one who escaped, was killed.

Both accounts are somewhat reconciled by a letter of Colonel William Snodgrass, written in 1845: "Near the Indian Camp the troops were surrounding the camp but before they got all the

way around the camp some of the men thought the Indians had discovered them and fired into their camp and killed six and wounded a number of them. As there was a small break [falls] there and the river being very flush at that time, it was supposed a number of them drowned in the river. By the account given by the Indians to our men on Christian's [Cherokee] Campaign [in November], there was but one or two of their company got back to the Indian Nation. There was a great trail of blood from the camp to the river. We got six scalps in the camp and one Indian found in a hollow log between the Camp and the river made seven scalps.

After this victory, only nine days following the defeat the Indians had suffered at the Long Island Flats, it took only Christian's Cherokee Campaign that fall to quiet the Cherokees and remove them as a threat until 1779.

Those interested in seeing this battle site, which is the only one in Washington Co., Virginia, must take U.S. 11 east from Abingdon. Turn right on Route 694. Near the end of 694, which parallels Greenway (then called Eleven Mile) Creek, on the right, there are remnants of the old mills that succeeded Kennedy's 1773 mill, but built on the same mill seat. Turn right at the dead end of 694 onto Route 706, turn left off of 706 onto 707. Follow this road, which is in poor condition but traversable, to near its dead end at the river. On the right will be seen the field of the 1776 battle. There is a place to turn around at the road's dead end.

Glade Spring, Virginia – Virginia Faye Snodgrass Johnson, 94, died peacefully at her home on May 27, 2009. She was the widow of the late James Gibson Johnson. She was born on April 10, 1915, in the Friendship community of Washington County, to the late Moses Lafayette and Joella McKee Snodgrass.

She was a graduate of Liberty Hall High School, attended Farmville State Teachers College (now Longwood University) and was a 1936 graduate of Emory & Henry College. During her teaching career, she taught at the one-room school of Friendship, and at Damascus and Liberty Hall Elementary Schools and Meadowview High School. A descendent of most of the original settlers of the area, she had lived in the Lodi community all of her life. She was known for her love of the history and her knowledge of the area. She was a long time member of the Historical Society of Washington County.

As one of the early 4-H members of the county, she later served as a 4-H leader, and was a longtime member, leader and officer of the Friendship Home Demonstration Club and the Washington County Extension Homemakers Council. She was a former member of the Abingdon Garden Club, the Washington County Republican Women's Club, and the Anna Stonewall Chapter of the U.D.C. For many years, she was active in the local, state and national chapters of the Rural Letter Carriers Association Auxiliary and traveled all over the United States to meetings of the National Rural Letter Carrier Association. She was a 69 year member of Sinking Spring Presbyterian Church where she had served as a Sunday School teacher, choir member and had assisted her late husband in the moving of the Parson Cummings Cabin to the church cemetery property.

She was preceded in death by her sisters, Louise Snodgrass Francis and Marjorie Snodgrass Snodgrass; and by her teenage brother, William McKee Snodgrass. She is survived by her daughters Joella Johnson Barbour of Glade Spring, Virginia, and Sylvia Jeanne Johnson of Elkins, West Virginia, and her son, James McKee Johnson of Glade Spring, Virginia; grandsons, Benjamin Gibson Barbour, Richmond, Virginia, William Bertram, Jenner McKee, and Charles David Corey Johnson, all of Glade Spring, Virginia; granddaughters, Margaret Barbour Williams (John H.) of Brunswick, Georgia, and Lauralee Brooke Johnson of New York, New York; two great-grandsons, Jackson McGuire and Keegan Gibson Williams; and a former son-in-law, the Reverend Edwin Benjamin Barbour of Axton, Virginia.

Letter dated 15 Oct 1980 from Virginia Stephenson to Scott Hosier:

There is a direct descendant of David Snodgrass through Major James Snodgrass living at this time on land which has descended to her and only a few miles from the David Snodgrass home (sometimes referred to as the Snodgrass fort for it was that during Lord Dunmore's wars) and the Rock Springs Cemetery in which James and wife are buried. She is Mrs. James J. Johnson, Hwy 91, RFD #1, Glad Spring, VA. She has xerox copies of the James Snodgrass Bible and many other items including his original ledgers. He conducted quite a business in the merchandising field and continued it after his death. In her records she has the following statistics (some of which disagree with what we have been told) concerning the children of James Snodgrass and Ann his wife (Ann Long):

Rebecca b. 22 Dec 1782 m. David Glenn 19 Feb 1801 (note—this disagrees with her marriage to Samuel Preston. We had already discovered this to be in error for her death is recorded in the Washington Co. Court records and states that she is the daughter of William Snodgrass and (I believe) Catherine).

Margaret, b. 10 Sept 1784 m. Stephen Lyon. Margaret d. 23 Jan 1873.

Martha, b. 4 Oct 1786 m. 6 Feb 1812 William Glenn. Martha d. 13 Sept 1844.

Sarah, b. 20 Sept 1788 m. 29 Oct 1807 Benjamin Glenn.

David, b. 26 Apr 1790 m. 3 times—Mary Ann Johnson, Minerva Brown, and Linney Bradley. He d. 1 Nov 1865.

William, b. 4 Oct 1792 m. Miss Oglesby (note—this disagrees with the info. that he m. Chatt Anderson)

Mary (Polly) Ann, b. 15 Apr 1795 m. 10 Dec 1818 Jacob Lyon (note—Jacob and Stephen Lyon were brothers, sons of Humberson Lyon)

James, b. 25 Dec 1798 m. twice – Margaret Capps & Margaret McKinney. He died 29 Jan 1853.

The above information was either gotten from the family Bible or from Beverly Fleet's Abstract of Colonial Virginia Records.

Mrs. Johnson had the dates for James Snodgrass's birth 13 Oct 1762 and his death 3 July 1828. He m. Ann Long 30 Oct 1781. In light of the fact that Washington was not created until 1776, it is correct to state that James was born in Botetourt Co., Virginia, for Washington was cut from Fincastle and Montgomery, and they in turn were not created until 1772 & 1776 & from Botetourt (Montgomery also from Fincastle and Pulaski) so the place where he was born, although later falling into Washington Co., Virginia, was Botetourt in 1762. His children, however, were born not in Botetourt but in Washington Co., Virginia.

Mrs. Johnson says she lives on land that originally belonged to David Snodgrass. She is a double descendant of his (as I understand it) both through her mother and her father. She told us where the David Snodgrass land was, and we visited it and the house (which was the fort), and we took pictures of it. It has been modernized and added onto, so has changed a great deal; however, the original log structure still remains (both inside and outside) as do the fireplaces. The people who live there invited us in and gave us this article, which I shall xerox for you. If the pictures turn out well, I will send you one.

The stone of James Snodgrass is almost not readable. We talked to Mrs. Johnson and asked if we could make her co-signee if we had the govt. provide a stone for this grave. They will do this for veterans. As soon as we get caught up, we will process the papers.

I was about to forget—Mrs. Johnson also gave me some info on the children of David Snodgrass and Margaret Glenn. She says

William Snodgrass m. Sarah Long 22 Aug 1786. He went to Sullivan Co., Tennessee (note—this disagrees with the m. to Mary Elder, dau. of Matthew).

James m. Ann Long (which we knew)

John m. Jean Long 25 June 1799

David m. Rebecca Edmiston (this disagrees with our info that he m. Mary Hutchison)

Robert m. Patsey Grimes 21 Nov 1799

Joseph m. Nancy Hutton 15 Sept 1787. He died in 1828.

Benjamin m. Mary ____.
Mary m. John Wills.
Jean m. John Coffield.
Martha m. ____ Bowls & 2nd Frances Clark in Hardin Co., Tennessee.

Undated letter from from Virginia Stephenson to Scott Hosier:

Am just now reading the Mace and note that you ask for any additions of Snodgrass's from High on a Windy Hill—those buried in Washington Co., Virginia. I have the following to make, and think they are rather important—most, if not all, you would have not gotten because they are Snodgrass girls and therefore have their married surname.

Buried in the Rock Spring Cemetery, which is either on or almost on land originally owned by David Snodgrass, the progenitor of this group). The woman in charge of the Historical Society of Washington Co., Virginia, says there is no doubt that he was the first Snodgrass in the area. Mrs. Johnson, a descendant of his through Major James Snodgrass, lives a stones throw from this cemetery and also from the Snodgrass Fort, a house which is still being lived in, and on land originally owned by David. By the way—across the road from the Rock Spring Church (Presbyterian).

Sarah, wife of Benjamin Glenn, 20 Sep 1788 – 25 Nov 1860, age 72y 2m 5d (note—Sarah is the 4th child of Major James Snodgrass and his wife Ann Long).

Note—Margaret Lyon is the 2nd child of Major James Snodgrass and his wife Ann Long. it is through Margaret that my husband, Larry Stephenson, is descended. We tried to find these stones when in Washington Co., Virginia, and although we did locate the cemetery, it is grown up with briars, and we could not. We are most thankful someone did earlier. As a further note—Stephen Lyon was the son of Capt. Humberson Lyon of the Washington Co. militia during the Revolution. My husband has established him as a Revolutionary War ancestor for the SAR, and I have established him for my husband's mother for the DAR. It is a new line, but now—anyone descended from James and Ann's daughter Margaret Lyon is eligible & would have to do very little work.

Also buried in this cemetery is Sarah Parrot, and she was a dau. of Stephen and Margaret Lyon and a granddaughter of Major James and Ann Snodgrass.

I am sure there are many others of the daughters, but these are the only ones of which I know at the time. We could not find the stone for some in the Rock Springs Cemetery. Ann (Long) Snodgrass, wife of Major James, is said to be buried there, but her stone is completely gone. We did find his, but could read nothing but Ma__James Snodgrass, and could hardly read that. We are going to have a stone place there identifying him as a Revolutionary War soldier. Mrs. Johnson will accept it and see that it is placed in the right spot.

Now—as to identifying parents of those who were married in Washington Co., Virginia. All of these were children of Major James and Ann Snodgrass:

Rebecca and David Glenn
Sarah and Benjamin Glenn

Martha and William Glenn
Jane and Isaac Taylor
Polly and Jacob Lyon

Several of the children of Major James and Ann Snodgrass went to Tennessee and were married there. I cannot tell you why there seems to be no record of the marriage of Stephen Lyon and Margaret Snodgrass, but it is an accepted fact and in the Bible of Major James. You will note that the marriage of Major James and Ann Long is not recorded here either. I do not know why, for the marriage of his brother William to Sarah Long is. They were both sons of David Snodgrass. Other children of David Snodgrass and his wife Margaret Glenn are:

Robert and Patsey Grimes
Joseph and Nancy Ann Hutton (listed as Ann in the record but the family called her Nancy)
Jean and John Coffield
Catherine and James Smith
Margaret and John Curtain

I can plainly see now, that you do not have William Snodgrass and Ann Long with Wm. being the son of David. Mrs. Johnson says that this is the way it is, however, and that the William who m. Mary Elder is another William. She could probably fill you in on the parentage of some of the other of these because she is descended from Snodgrasses on both sides of her family and has many records including xerox copies of the old Bibles.

Dear Mr. Cole,

I read with much interest your letter. I have often wished that I had the time to study my ancestry more fully. I have a very old Bible which I assume belonged to William Redshaw as his name is on the back cover a number of times. The front of the Bible is too yellowed to read the name on it. In it is recorded two lists of names. One list consists of the names of Moses Snodgrass and his wife Margaret L. and their children. It is the list you received from me. The second list I judge consists of William Redshaw, his brothers and sisters and his children. It looks to have been recorded years before the first list. According to the way it is divided on the page, I assume that James, Philip (Barwick?), Mary Ann Grace and Margaret Long were William Renshaw's children. In both lists, Margaret Long Redshaw's birth date appears 15th day, Aug 1815. Fanny Simpson's Redshaw's name is not found in my Bible. From this list, I merely assume that Margaret Long Redshaw was the daughter of William Redshaw.

There is also in this Bible a section of a piece of paper. On it I find the following

"give them up at Jesus call
To pardon, bless and save them all.
Philip Redshaw
Nancy Redshaw
Elizabeth Jane Redshaw
James Madison Redshaw
William Thomas Redshaw

Joseph Campbell Redshaw
Pheobe (Blender?) Redshaw
Margaret Caroline Redshaw
Andrew McBroom Redshaw."

There is also in this Bible a deed drawn in 1836 by which Joseph Redshaw and his wife Phoebe conveyed a tract of land on the Middle Fork of the Holston to John F. Loyd.

I have been told by my father that some of his Snodgrass ancestors were buried in Rock Springs Cemetery. It is my intention to search the stones to see if I can recognize any names.

It is also interesting to me that concerning family lore--about "Black Joe" and "White Joe" that there were in the next generation a "White Bill" which was my grandfather, a "Black Bill," a "Lanhy Bill" and a "Mountain Bill." Had you ever heard that?

I, too, have heard my father say that some of his grandfather's brothers moved to Tenn., near Ritherwood[?], Kingsport, Joseph Henry did and on to California. His three daughters live in Exeter[?] and incidentally their mother was Elizabeth Robinson. I believe some of your relatives.

I hope you find this information enlightening and useful and I apologize for being so long in completing your letter.

Sincerely, Mrs. James G. Johnson

P.S. The farm on which I reside was inherited and bought by my father and grandfather from Redshaw Snodgrass heirs.

I would be interested in getting your reaction to the lists found in the Renshaw Bible.

The Long Family

Three men named Snodgrass seemed to have married Longs (a name common in Washington Co., Virginia, and the Valley of Virginia:

Sarah Long married a William Snodgrass

Ann Long was wife of Maj. James Snodgrass

Jean Long married John Snodgrass 1799.

I was not able to figure out who Sarah married, but his name was William Snodgrass, likely the William who left a will in Washington Co. 1830.

The Two Joseph Snodgrasses, Black Joe and White Joe:

On my interviews with persons of the Snodgrass blood in Washington Co., Virginia, in 1930, constant reference was made to Black Joe and White Joe Snodgrass. They appeared to be of different family groups, but somehow related. They were likely first cousins, but I may be a mile off. It seems likely that Black Joe was son of William Snodgrass of the will of 1830, while White Joe is known to be a son of Major James Snodgrass of the will of 1828.

In later pages we will give the families of these two Joes, and comments as to their possible relationship.

Individual Family Sketches--Snodgrass & Related Families.

Outside of the efforts of Mrs. Marshan of Texas, it does not appear that prior to 1935 any effort was made by any member of the Snodgrass tribe to assemble records of more than a few families. Mrs. Marshan obtained data from some old family Bibles kept on the Holston, and in this way preserved for us some family lines extending in some cases beyond three generations. In the next few pages we shall type out several of these family stories as I found them, or as I reconstructed them.

A. BENJAMIN SNODGRASS--A Study in Tangled Family Relationships.

(This section of our story is here inserted in these family notes, as it belongs here and shows many facts worthy of record concerning early Washington Co. Families. It clearly develops the fact that many of the early Snodgrass folks were also Edmiston. They clearly lived in the same region, and inevitably they intermarried numerous times. This name Edmiston, it should be noted, finally became Edmondson. It appears likely that all the Edmiston came from the Shenandoah and James River region to SW Virginia, that is to say, they followed the trend of migration from the Northeast over the divide into the James Region, thence southwest over the divide into the New River region and then over still another divide into the Holston section.

Near the town of Meadowview, Virginia, there lived in 1930 a widow Lyda Belle (Edmondson) Snodgrass, relict of David Grant Snodgrass. The couple had been married 14 Oct 1885. They were the parents of ten children, all born near that town, as follows:

- 1) Sallie Elizabeth Pearl Snodgrass, b. 5 Aug 1886.
- 2) Gordon Edmondson Snodgrass, b. 27 Apr 1888, d. 1888.

- 3) Samuel Volney Snodgrass, b. 22 Jun 1889; m. Pauline A. Snodgrass.
- 4) Annie Gertrude Snodgrass, b. 7 July 1893; was married.
- 5) Leola Katherine Snodgrass, b. 27 Jul 1895; was married.
- 6) John Henry Snodgrass, b. 29 Jun 1898.
- 7) David Grant Snodgrass, b. 16 Sep 1900; d. 11 Mar 1914.
- 8) Audrey Matilda Snodgrass, b. 4 Apr 1903.
- 9) Spurgeon Oliver Snodgrass, b. 20 Jun 1906.
- 10) Lydia Bell Snodgrass, b. 15 Sep 1910.

Now the children in this family proved to be the only living descendants of a Snodgrass (Benjamin, born in 1781, or nearly 150 years earlier. They were not of one family. They appear to have in their veins the blood of two distinct Snodgrass family groups, and two if not three Edmiston or Edmondson groups.

The story of this family starts with a Benjamin Snodgrass, who lived at least for a time prior to his death in Washington Co., Virginia. Where he came from, I was unable to discover. The names of his parents seem unknown. Mrs. D. G. Snodgrass told me that so far as could be determined, he was not of the same Snodgrass family as that which inhabited Washington Co.

Mrs. Snodgrass said that Benjamin was twice married. The name of his first wife, who left his bed and board for another, taking his horses and livestock, was not mentioned in this family. After this wayward spouse had remarried, probably without the benefit of a legal divorce, Mr. Snodgrass then nearly fifty years old, took unto himself another wife. He married in Washington Co., Virginia, 14 May 1829, Elizabeth C. Fleming, a native of Tennessee. She evidently was a much younger woman than her husband. since she was from Tennessee, it seems likely he too was from that region.

William was born in Washington Co., Virginia, about 1760. Moved about 3 miles over into Sullivan Co., TN. He was 20 years old at battle of Kings Mountain. My grandfather bought a farm from him 22 May 1849, and was his neighbor. He married Rachel White 1 Mar 1792. John Jr., brother to William and James, is the direct ancestor of the Snodgrass family of Alabama. The Whites were Sullivan Co., TN, people.

I know the family here: Mrs. Solomon, the Trobetts, and Piles, descendants of William Snodgrass and Rachel White, but I never talked to them about the family record.

The cousin Ann you refer to in your letter was my paternal grandmother, the mother of the 15 children who lived to be grown. Two died in early life or in infancy. Of the 15, only 3 are living at present: Aunt Kate, age 81, and blind; Uncle William J. Legard, age 75; and the youngest daughter, Mrs. Robert Craig of Glade Springs, Virginia.

Aunt Kate says there was a cousin Thomas Snodgrass in Missouri a few years ago. My grandmother was Ann Preston, and from the old Preston Bible this reference:

Samuel Preston and Rebecca Snodgrass, m. 19 Jan 1832.

Ann Jones Preston, m. 25 Jan 1848, Roland T. Legard.

I am the daughter of the second son of this union, Robert Morris.

Mr. Cole, you will remember some time ago you made a copy of the above described deed.

Now I am of the opinion since members of our family say that we are descended from a William Snodgrass, that more than likely the William referred to in the trust deed is the William we are looking for. This William being the father of James.

And very likely (refer to W.B. 4, page 188) (and also refer to data sent you by Mrs. Johnson of Glade Springs, birth records of the Redshaw children), Mary Redshaw who m. James Snodgrass is a sister of Joseph Redshaw Sr., adm. of Wm. Redshaw dec'd.

And very likely this William is the parent of the Redshaw children Mrs. Johnson sent.

Now as noted above the William who buys the land in 1844 is the brother to the grantors. As you may remember, he married 6 Feb 1840, Rachel Robinson. She died 3 Nov 1858.

Then 22 Sep 1859 he married Nancy Jane Greer; she died 1870. This Wm. was born about 1809. Wm.'s oldest son J. H. in the early 70's had emigrated to Texas 26 Mar 1874. J. H. married Hattie ___? They then went back to Virginia for a visit, and it was after this that the family moved to Azle, TX, where the above William d. 20 Dec 1888.

Now also refer to the excerpts from the diary of Ales. L. Robinson of Wash. Co., Virginia, I have previously sent you. Observe the year 1888.

If you can Wright to Hon. L P Summers Abingdon Va He is a lawyer and also Ex state senator. he has published a history of South West Va and he has the marriage records and court Preeadings and every thang of old in it the history sells for Five Dollars and can be obtained by the Outher.

I wont you to be shurre and send me what you know about the SnodGrass people and would be glad to now who gave you my name.

I thank i can find out lots of thangs here that would be good for You to know.

Application for marriage had proposed place of marriage, Osaka, and was issued same day as marriage. Age of John Snodgrass given as 21, born Jonesville, living Osaka, Virginia, and Bessie McCann was listed as 19, born North Carolina and mailing address of Osaka. The husband's father was listed as E. L. Snodgrass and his mother as Florence Bays. The wife's father was listed as T. C. McCann and her mother as Myrtle Gilly [sic; should be Dishman]. The occupation of the husband was given as miner.

A typed letter, dated July 11, 1930 from Osaka, Virginia, gave consent to the issuance of a marriage license to Bessie McCann who at that date was 19 years of age and signed by T. C. McCann. The clerk of the Circuit Court accepted a sworn statement from John Snodgrass that this was a verified letter from T. C. McCann.

The license repeated the age of 21 and 19 for the groom and bride, and the same material on the application for the marriage license regarding the parents of the bride and groom. The place of birth of the groom was listed as Danville, Virginia [sic; application and other material indicates the birth was in Jonesville, Lee County, Virginia]. The marriage was held on July 12, 1930 by R. O. Eller minister of the Methodist Church of Big Stone Gap, Wise County, Virginia; Eller signed the certificate on July 14, 1930.

[On the same day a marriage license was issued to Elsie Snodgrass and to Dewey McCann who were the sister and brother of the above two. Their marriage was also held on the same date by the same minister in Big Stone Gap.]

1936 -- The Rev. Patrick Eugene Snodgrass wrote in 1936: "George Snodgrass and his wife are buried in unmarked graves in the George Snodgrass Cemetery [Wise Co., Virginia]. George Snodgrass was a son of Joseph and Mary Snodgrass of Botetourt Co. He married Nancy St. Clair in Bedford Co., and moved to the Clinch Valley and settled at the Old Courthouse in Russell Co. He lived there a few years and then moved to Benges Branch, in what is now Wise Co., and settled where the Norton Floral Company's greenhouse is now. There he operated a tanyard, and there he lived out his days. I think he died in 1883, and that he was about 78 years old. A man named Jack Akers is also buried there, or I might say he was buried there.
